Lindbergh baby kidnapping case, crime, Huey Long and the freedom of the  
press, political exiles, and World War II.

There are three naturalization ceremony programs, 1931, 1942, and 1943.  
Each has a schedule of events and the first two programs include a list  
of the new citizens.
