261 The Code of Judicial Conduct approved and adopted by the American Bar Association on August 16, 1972, governs the conduct of all the judges of this state, constitutional and statutory.
270 This booklet describes the seven canons (codes) a judge should abide by. 1. A judge should uphold the integrity and independence of the judiciary. 2. A judge should avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety in all his activities. 3. A judge should perform the duties of his office impartially and diligently. 4. A judge may engage in activities to improve the law, the legal system, and the administration of justice. 5. A judge should regulate his extra-judicial activities to minimize the risk of conflict with his judicial duties. 6. A judge should regularly file reports of compensation received for quasi-judicial and extra-judicial activities. 7. A judge should refrain from political activity inappropriate to his judicial office. All judges, including justices of the peace, should comply with this code except that masters in Chancery and Family Court masters shall comply with the code as specified by special order of the Supreme Court.
