27X Quartermaster reports (1864 - 1866), Muster-in Rolls, Miscellaneous rolls, Morning reports and monthly returns, Muster-out rolls, General materials, and enrollment books (1862), a roster of Company D, Delaware Volunteers from July 15, 1861 to December 31, 1861; newspapers "The Regimental Flag" volume I #'s 3, 4, 6 & 7, 1862; service records of Daniel Woodall, 1861-1864 and John Schilling, 1862-1865; First general order given to the 1st Delaware inf. Regt. Quartermaster reports document the issuance and return of property and equipment by the Quartermaster including property and ordinance returns, monthly return of clothing, camp and equipage and invoices of stores.

Morning Reports (1864-1865, 0.4 cf.) are daily reports on the number of men in the 9th Regiment of Delaware Volunteers, from October 14, 1864 to January 20, 1865. Morning Reports provide the date of the report, where they were stationed (Camp Brandywine and Fort Delaware), name of the commanding officer, list of companies, number of men and officers present and absent, reason for the absence, totals, and signatures of the commanding officer and adjutant. They are arranged chronologically by date of report.

Monthly Returns (1864, 11 folders) are monthly reports on the number of men in the 9th Regiment of Delaware Volunteers, from October to December 1864. Monthly Returns provide the date of the report, where they were stationed (Fort Delaware), name of the commanding officer, list of companies, number of men and officers present and absent, reason for the absence, totals, and signatures of the commanding officer and adjutant. Also included is a list of enlisted men assigned to extra or daily duty which shows their name, company, and the duty assigned. Men that were absent were listed by name, company, and the reason for the absence was given. A list of all the Regiment commissioned officers is provided on the back which shows their rank, company, station (Fort Delaware), and comments. They are arranged chronologically by date of return.

Quartermaster Reports (1864-1865, 0.94 cf.) include correspondence, receipts for supplies received, and monthly returns of clothing and equipment issued. The returns show the unit location, date, name of the person making the return, and amounts of various types of clothing, fuel, forage, stationery, camp equipment, furniture, wagon and horse equipment, record books, and armaments. They are arranged chronologically by date of record.
