261 Permits required to move or bury a body. After a death certificate was delivered to the registrar of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, the registrar was required to issue a permit authorizing the removal of the body for burial. Undertakers, sextons, or any other person could not move or bury the deceased unless the burial permit had been produced.

27X Information contained on the permit includes the permit number; place of death (county, hundred, town); sex, color, age, and name of deceased; date and cause of death; physician or coroner giving death certificate; place of burial; name of undertaker; dates of permit and burial; and signature of the registrar. A few disinterment permits are also included. Entries on these permits include the date, the names of the undertaker and deceased, cause of death, date of death, cemetery in which deceased was buried, cemetery to which deceased was to be moved, and signatures of the secretary, State Board of Health officer, and local health officer.
