 261 Quarterly lists submitted to the county treasurer of the fines imposed by the justices of the peace.
 270 While each justice had his own unique style of recording fines for the treasurer, generally entries include a by case listing of the activity of the justice. Information includes names of plaintiff and defendant, charge, location of crime, date of crime, judgment, amount of fine, name of constable receiving the fine, and date of judgment. At the end of the list is a certification statement signed and dated by the justice. In 1811 Delaware law mandated that the justices submit returns to the Auditor of Accounts (4 DL ch 464). In 1813 this section was repealed, and the justice submitted his returns to the county treasurer who, in turn, submitted them to the Auditor of Accounts (4 DL ch 225). In 1821 the returns were once again submitted to the Auditor of Accounts (6 DL ch 61).
