 27X Road papers consist primarily of petitions, orders, and returns for the purpose of building or altering a road. A person desiring to build a road petitioned the court for permission to do so. A petition contains the name of the petitioner, location of road, date, description of work to be done, and signatures of petitioners. If the court agreed, it ordered free holders to be appointed to view the area where the road would be built and to make recommendations. Orders included the names of the freeholders, petitioners, date, location, and instructions. Returns are the report of the freeholders. They record the date, location of road, names of landowners, recommendations, and signatures of free holders. Surveyor's plots are sometimes included. Series includes items from Court of Common Pleas and the General Assembly, such as petitions or copies of legislative acts.
