261 Robert Marker was a contractor, sold and delivered coal and fuel oil,
and owned a hardware store in Wyoming, Delaware. These ledgers are
financial records of his business enterprises.
270 Two of the ledgers record the items sold. They show the name of the
customer, date, items purchased, folio number, amount owed, amount paid,
and balance. Customers of interest include the State Board of Education,
Kent County Almshouse, Magnolia Civilian Conservation Corps, Kent County
Levy Court, Libby, McNeill and Libby, Town of Wyoming, Caesar Rodney
School, as well as many other local businesses and individuals.

The other ledgers (1927-1938) are employee time books. The larger book
has the name of the employee as the account heading and for each day it
shows the name of the job or type of work performed, whether it was
carpentry, plumbing and heating, masonry, or coal, number of hours,
amount earned, and amount paid each week. The 1927-1930 book has the
job name as the account heading and shows the number of hours each
employee worked.
