261 Primarily a collection of programs, informational booklets,
brochures, publications and invitations compiled by Charles W.
Canfield.
270 Charles W. Canfield, the son of Charles B. Canfield and Mary
Canfield, was born in 1856 in Connecticut and died September 9th,
1934 in Wilmington. He attended Yale University and matriculated
in 1878 with a degree in literature. Charles W. Canfield lived in
New York City where he occasionally wrote for local newspapers
and served as Vice President of Empire Monument Company (ca.
1910). He moved to Wilmington in the early 20th century and
briefly worked for the Delaware Public Archives Commission in
Wilmington (ca. 1927-1928). Letters from this time suggest that
he also contributed to an ad campaign for Wilmington Trust around
1924.

Canfield's collection of publications offers a view into his
various interests as well as his involvement with Wilmington
Trust. A substantial portion of this collection is Wilmington
Chamber of Commerce monthly publications from ca. March 1928
through June 1933. These magazines prominently feature an ad
campaign for Wilmington Trust that Canfield was possibly involved
in creating. Pursuant to this, this collection contains a folder
of programs from the Shubert Playhouse (no date), Wilmington,
that also features a Wilmington Trust ad campaign. There is also
a folder of full-page Wilmington Trust ads and a typed
publication schedule.

Also included are a number of programs, brochures and invitations
(1894-1932). A few notable items include an invitation to the
wedding of Harry Canfield (1897), A 1920 publication called
"Delaware Health News," A program from the opening of the
Chesapeake and Delaware Canal(1927), and "Work and Relief in
Delaware" (1931-1932).
