270 The Gilbride Family scrapbook contains photographs and documents relating to Vera Gilbride Davis's parents, siblings, and children. John and Mary Gilbride were Vera Davis's parents. John Gilbride was a clothing merchant in Wilmington, Delaware. John and Mary had five children: John I. Gilbride, Joseph, Leah, Vera, and Mary (Bobbie) and they are all featured in the scrapbook. A majority of the photographs are of Bobbie Davis. Other photographs include: John J. Gilbride in his clothing store, John I. Gilbride in his World War I uniform, photos of the family home at 212 N. Broom Street, Wilmington, Delaware, Leah Gilbride with Hugh Shields, portrait of Mary Crowlish Gilbride, baby photos of the children, group family photos, their summer home at 32 Delaware Avenue, Rehoboth Beach, Delaware, Frank Hall Davis, Jr. and John Gilbride Davis outside the family summer home in Rehoboth, S.S. Thomas Tracey aground on the beach at Rehoboth, and Aunt Bobbie with Frank Hall Davis, Jr. outside Grace Church in Wilmington. Also included is a Dover Choral Society program for "The Chimes of Normandie," Rehoboth Beach house rental card for 32 Delaware Avenue, newspaper article on Bobbie Gilbride and her impact on Rehoboth Beach, World War I window display card which was hung in the windows of families homes of men serving in the Armed Services, John J. Gilbrides obituary, funeral remembrance cards for Leah Gilbride, Mary Gilbride, and Lillian Gilbride, announcement for a public auction of antiques, personal property, and real estate of Bobbie Gilbride, and cousin Edward I. Crumlish's life insurance policy.
