 270 James N. Eckles had joined the First Delaware Cavalry unit in 1863 as a private. He would be discharged from the same unit as First Lieutenant in January of 1865. The letter was addressed to Captain Eramus C. Dunning of the First Delaware Cavalry. The letter is date March 3, 1865. Captain Dunning would resign from service on March 14, 1865. Lt. Eckles and the First Delaware Cavalry participated at the Battle of Westminster in Maryland, where they engaged a Confederate Cavalry unit led by JEB Stuart on June 29, 1863. The letter's contents discusses James Eckles current health, news of the regiment and hopes to catch upon with each other soon. James Eckles would die later that year in December. Eramus Dunning would become a physician, marry in 1872 and die in 1880 in Wilmington, Delaware.
