 261 Records relating to the Civil War service of French. He was born in Manchester, New Hampshire, in 1844, moved to Delaware in the late 1800s, and died in Wilmington, Delaware, in 1914. He was a private in the Fifth New Hampshire Volunteers, 1861-1865.
 270 Records include two military discharge papers, 1862 and 1865. Discharges note his rank, unit he served with, name of commanding officer, date enlisted, date and place of discharge, reason for discharge, place of birth, age, physical description, occupation before service, and signature of the commanding officer.

 Other Civil War related records include a printed Roster of Original Members of Company E, 5th New Hampshire Volunteers and a membership certificate for the Phil Sheridan Post No. 23 of the Grand Army of the Republic, Wilmington, 1896. The undated Roster lists all the members of the company and notes their rank or position and age. It may also show if they were deceased, if they had died during the war with the name of the battle and date, if they deserted, date they mustered out, and if living, their current place of residence.

 Also included in the folder is some recent genealogical information. A large certificate of membership in the American Flag House and Betsy Ross Memorial Association is also present.
