270 Contains a correspondence from Henry L. Hopkins and was sent to Washington M. Gibbons (1819-1843) in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The letter is a cordial response to a friend and notes the personal activities of others in the Seaford area. Mr. Gibbons is also from Sussex County, Delaware, and will, in a few years after this letter, return to this area and purchase land in Northwest Fork Hundred. Mr. Gibbons' parents were Dr. John Gibbons, who had emigrated from Ireland, and Leah Arah Turpin. Leah's father was Major Francis Turpin of Dorchester County, Maryland and he served as an officer during the Revolutionary War.
