261 Correspondence and personal papers of the Luff and Warren families of Kent County, mostly from the nineteenth century. Other related families include the Harrington, Clendaniel, Artis, McGuire, Thorn, and Gray families.
- 270 The collection includes a variety of correspondences, personal papers, receipts, and accounts of the Luff and Warren families. Dr. Nathaniel Luff, of Kent County, is of main focus within the collection as well as his daughter, Susanna Warren, through a multiplicity of their personal papers and correspondences. There are also deeds, leases, and accounts displaying the family relationships within the Luff family and the extent of their family inventories suggests a family that lived comfortably in the nineteenth century.

Documents of interest include the personal journal of Dr. Nathaniel Luff, in which includes over two hundred pages of detailed personal accounts of his life. Through each entry, his personality, characteristics, and information regarding his family are revealed. The documents range from the late eighteenth and into the early nineteenth century, providing an in-depth perspective of the Luff family, specifically that of Dr. Nathaniel Luff.

A majority of the documents also tend to relate to Susanna Warren, daughter of Nathaniel. Through the vast amounts of her correspondences, personal papers, receipts, and accounts the life of Susanna and her family and friends are also displayed.

Other documents of interest within the collection includes the portrait of the Luff family tree in which it lays out how each Luff is connected in the family. It also provides birth and death dates of the Luff family members and shows the children from Dr. Nathaniel Luff's second marriage.

Also included in the collection are two recipes, one including the amount of money the ingredients would add up to.
