Old Fashioned Fire Race", 1894; "High School Polka", 1895, Dedicated to  
the Teachers and scholars of the Wilmington High School; "Formosa,  
Japanese Flower Dance", 1902; "The Old Fisherman's Story" by Joseph E.  
McGullen and Will M. S. Brown; "State Fencibles March", 1894 and "In  
Cupid's Net", 1904. Will M. S. Brown also wrote "Our Delaware", the  
official Delaware State Song.  
Also found here is one issue of the Wilmington newspaper for those  
interested in literature and music, the *Local Graphics*, for May 28,  
1892. This paper began publication in 1891 under the name *Chimes*.
