 270 The collection consists of three large scrapbooks, newspaper clippings,
 photographs, and books. There are extensive newspaper clippings dealing
 with Governor Terry's campaign against David Buckson, Presidential
 visits to Delaware, and general Delaware politics.

The first scrapbook contains a telegram invitation to attend Robert Kennedy Requiem mass, a photograph of Judge Charles L. Terry speaking at Thiokol Democracy in Action Program, photograph of Governor Terry and Carvel, photograph of state tax Christmas party, photographs from the dedication of the bronze head of President Kennedy presented to the state by Mr. A.I. DuPont Bayard, photos of Henry T. Price, Chairman of the State Highway Department swearing in, a menu from dinner at the White House, photo of Governor Terry with Brazil's ambassador, program for 5th Annual Governor's Prayer Breakfast for our State Leadership, photogs of Governor Terry and Mrs. Jonathan W. Wilhains, President of the Delaware Federation of Garden Clubs, program for the Governor's conference 57th Annual Meeting in Minneapolis, 5 cent traffic safety commemorative U.S. postage stamp, program for City County Dinner at State Armory, The Last Will and Testament of George Washington, certificate for being Guest Lecturer at the University of Delaware, Honorary Life Membership Distributive Education Clubs of America, photographs of 18th Annual Delmarva Chicken Festival, Delaware State Day at New York World's Fair, Delaware Safety Council Luncheon, and Georgetown Raceway 41st Night winner 4th Race Bombardier. A majority of the scrapbook consists of newspaper clippings. Topics included are Terry inauguration ceremonies and festivities, Lyndon B. Johnson's visit to Delaware, Ku Klux Klan, budget, talks on bills, Governor Terry's revenue plans, Heritage Trail planned in Delaware w/ Buck Tavern, Allee House, Dickinson Mansion, and Old Eight Side School, pre-restored Woodburn articles and photographs, and Bill Frank articles.

The second scrapbook contains state library photographs, photographs of the bookmobile in 1929 and 1966, The Esther Peterson Reception program at the Hotel Dupont, Certificate from Governor of New York proclaiming July 2, 1963 as Delaware Day at the New York State Fair, photograph of Governor Terry and Henry Vicardi, Advertisement for Delaware Open for the Charles L. Terry Jr. Governor's Cup, Rehoboth Beach Country Club, photograph of Governor Terry with Miss. Delaware Mary Lee Mancini, Certificate of Achievement: Governor Terry boated a white marlin, Return Day photos, photographs taken at Chris Short testimonial dinner, and Jefferson-Jackson Day Dinner, Governor Terry w/ Robert Kennedy. Newspaper clippings in this scrapbook consist of Farnhurst studies jobs for patients, Terry resigns as trustee of UD, Terry vacations in Clearwater, Florida golfs and attends Phillies spring training (photo of Terry swinging bat w/ two Phillies players from Delaware, Delaware State College drops its accountant, Delaware Governor assists with Cumberland

bridge, 268 flee Farnhurst Mental Unit due to Fire, LBJ in Delaware, Clayton Cannery has a sanitary reputation, and Buena Vista to open in spring.

The third scrapbook contains photograph of Governor Terry behind a horse racer, letter to Governor Terry from Rochelle Messick (Miss Bo Peep 1967) inviting him to visit sheep pavilion at State Fair, YSC & Prison talk merger, and a photograph of Governor Terry at White House with LBJ. The newspaper clippings in this scrapbook consist of mental health issues, welfare, the text for Terry's State of the State message, plans for new school district lines, "Back to the Turn of the Century" newspaper spread of postcard collection of Mrs. Mary R. Hiasley, newspaper article on Governor Terry's grandson and his days at Woodburn, dedication of the Delaware State News printing plant at New Burton Road and Webbs Lane, Bill to curb Ku Klux Klan activities ok'd by Senate, renovation of Buena Vista, Wilmington riots, farm preservation group fights west Dover bypass, getting the buses rolling again in Wilmington, Delaware State Fair riot scare, and the Delaware National Guard in Wilmington.
