

VI That the Speaker of the Honble House of Assembly of this Government be desired to Write  
to the several Members in this County, Requesting them to convene at New Castle  
on or by the first day of August next to appoint Deputies to attend at a  
general Congress for the Colonies at such Time and place as shall be gene-  
rally agreed on.

VII That it is our Opinion that it wou'd conduce to the restoration of the lib-  
-ties of America, should the Colonies enter into a joint Agreement not to  
import any Articles of British Manufactory, or carry on any other  
branch of Trade, unless under such restrictions as may be agreed upon by  
the Congress.

VIII That the Committee hereinafter appointed, are hereby desired to receive  
the Subscriptions of such Charitable Persons in this County, who shall in-  
-cline  
to contribute towards the distressed and Suffering Inhabitants of the Town  
of Boston, and that the Money raised by such Subscriptions be dispo-  
sed of by the said Committee for the Use the said Inhabitants, whom we  
consider as Suffering in the common Cause of America.

IX That the Committee now to be chosen consist of Thirteen Persons, to wit-  
Thomas Robinson, Levin Crapper, Boaz Manlove, Benjamin Burton  
and John Wiltbank Esq<sup>r</sup>. and Stephen Townsend Gentlemen, the Repre-  
sentatives of this County, and David Hall Esq. the Rev. Matthew Will-  
-son Jacob Moore Esq<sup>r</sup>. M<sup>r</sup>. John Clowes, Daniel Nunez Esq<sup>r</sup>. John Rod-  
-ney Esq<sup>r</sup>. and M<sup>r</sup>. William Peery, who or any seven of them being duly  
notified are to meet and correspond with the other Provinces, and Coun-  
-ties of this Government and to give Instructions to our Deputies, for  
the intended Congress when Chosen, in Order that all may Unite in  
Promoting and endeavouring to attain the great and valuable Ends  
mentioned in the Foregoing Resolutions.
