Pursuant to section 5 and subsection (c) of section 4 of the Federal Emergency Relief Act of 1934:

I, C. DOUGLASS BUCK, as Governor of the State of DELAWARE, hereby apply to the Federal Emergency Relief Administrator to grant to said State by payment to me as Governor of said State, the sum of NINE HUNDRED FORTY TWO DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS (\$942.50), to aid in meeting the costs of furnishing relief and work relief and in relieving the hardship resulting from unemployment in said State during the month or months of This date to the end of 1934 current academic school year, not including the summer


I HEREBY CERTIFY that the combined moneys which can be made available within said State from all sources, supplemented by any moneys available under subsection (b) of section 4, will fall below the estimated needs within the said State during the month or months of This date to the end of the current academic, 1934 school year, for the purposes specified in subsection (a) of section 4.

The sum paid to me upon this application shall be received for by the Governor of said State, pursuant to the provisions of the aforesaid act.

The Governor of said State will file monthly with the Federal Emergency Relief Administrator, and in the form required by him, a report of the disbursements made under this grant as provided by section 6 of the said act.

Information required under section 5 of the aforesaid act in support of this application is forwarded herewith.
