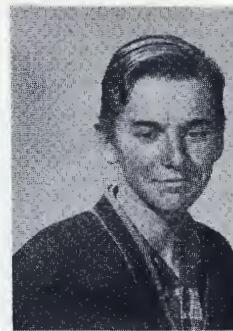

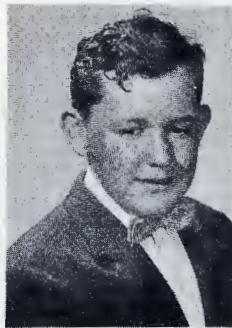

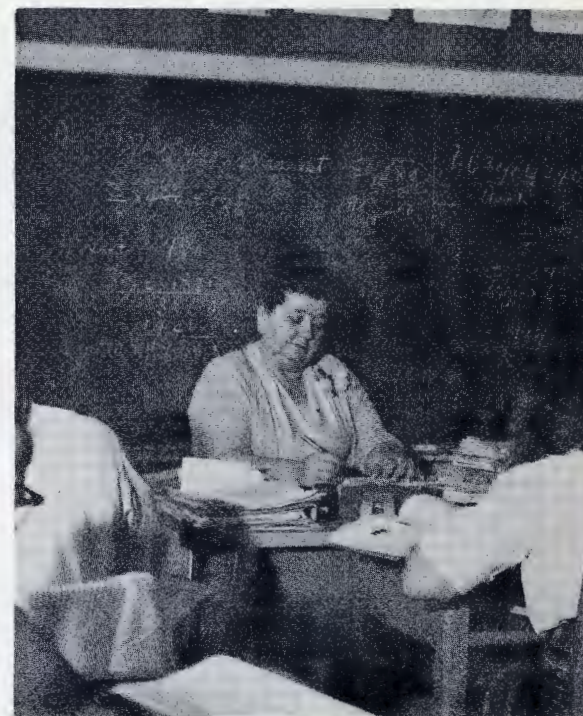

Art this year was a new kind of experience with more emphasis on crafts and individual attention that was not possible in the elementary grades.



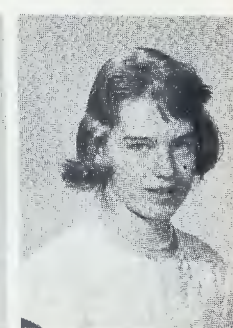

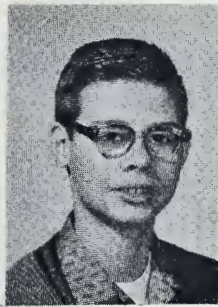
Guidance Counselor is responsible for the extensive testing program in the junior high school. Mr. Minka also teaches vocations.
