

- WILSON LEE CANNON 28 January 1817 7 February 1905...The path of the just is as the shining light that shineth more and more unto the perfect day.*
- ANN SCOTTEN, wife of WILSON LEE CANNON 17 April 1818 23 August 1859...He giveth his beloved sleep.
- ELLA CANNON wife of DR. S. D. MARSHALL 31 October 1847 9 April 1929
- SAMUEL D. MARSHALL, M. D. 9 May 1840 29 January 1892
- MARY E. CANNON BENSON 18 August 1851 10 March 1935
- MARY ELIZABETH, wife of WILSON L. CANNON 2 November 1839 22 December 1893... Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the Kingdom of their Father.*
- ANNIE JUMP CANNON 11 December 1863 13 April 1941... Astronomer of the Harvard Observatory, Cambridge, Massachusetts 1897 1941

*NOTE references to light and sun. The stones for Annie and her parents are marble carved to resemble coffin lids.
