Died Caper Carlisle & wife to Trustees Meeting house

This Indenture, made this eighteenth day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and forty nine between Caper Carlisle of Dover hundred Kent
County and State of Delaware and Sear his wife of the one part, and Peter Collins James
Collins, Nathaniel White, Jacob Alston & Perry Hawkins trustees in trust for the use and pur-
poses hereinafter mentioned, all of Dover hundred County & State aforesaid of the other
part. Witnesseth that the said Caper Carlisle and Sear his wife for and in considera-
tion of the sum of one dollar specie to the said Caper Carlisle, in hand paid, at and
upon the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is here by acknow-
ledged, have granted, bargained, sold, released, confirmed and conveyed, and by
these presents doth, grant, bargain, sell, release, confirm and convey unto them the
said Peter Carlisle, James Collins, Nathaniel White, Jacob Alston and Perry Hawkins
and their successors, trustees in trust for the use and purposes hereinafter mentioned
and declared, full the estate, right title, interest, property, claim and demand what-
soever either in law or in equity, which he the said Caper Carlisle and Sear his wife
hath (or have) in, to, or upon all and singular a certain lot or piece of land, situate ly-
ing and being in the forest of Dover hundred Kent County and State aforesaid con-
tained as follows, viz: Beginning at a Stake on the South side of the Road leading from
Dover to Davis Corner, running thence north sixty nine degrees West four perches to a line
on South side of said road, thence South fifty three and a half degrees West six and
two tenths perches thence South fifty and a half degrees East five and six tenths perches
North sixty three degrees East five and three tenths perches, thence North four degrees
West three and five tenths perches to the beginning, containing forty square perches of
land, be the same more or less, being part of some tract of land where the said Caper
Carlisle now lives, together with all and singular houses, woods, waters, ways, privi-
leges and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise pertaining. To Have and to
Hold all and singular the above mentioned and described lot or piece of land sit-
uated lying and being as aforesaid, together with all and singular the houses, woods,
waters, ways and privileges thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, unto the
said Peter Carlisle, James Collins, Nathaniel White, Jacob Alston & Perry Hawkins and

their Successors in Office for ever, in trust that they shall erect or cause to be built
 thereon a house or place of Worship for the use of the members of the African Methodist
 Episcopal Church in the United States of America according to the rules and discipline
 of said Church which from time to time may be adopted and agreed upon by the
 Minister and Preachers of the said Church at their General Conferences in the United
 States of America and in further trust and Confidence that they shall at all times for
 ever hereafter permit such Ministers and Preachers belonging to said Church as shall
 from time to time be duly authorized by the General Conference of the Ministers and
 Preachers of the said African Methodist Episcopal Church, or by the Annual Conference
 authorized by the said General Conference to Preach and ex pound Gods Holy word
 therein and in further trust and Confidence that as often as any one or more of Trustees
 herein before mentioned shall die or cease to be a member or members of said Church
 according to the rules and discipline aforesaid then and in such case it shall be the
 duty of the Stationed Minister or preacher authorized as aforesaid who shall have
 the pastoral charge of the members of said Church to call a Meeting of the remain-
 ing trustees as soon as conveniently may be, and when so met, the said Minister or pre-
 cher shall proceed to nominate one or more persons to fill the place or places of him
 or them whose Office or Offices has or have been Vacated as aforesaid, provided the
 person or persons so nominated shall have been one Year a member or members
 of the said Church immediately preceding such nomination and be at least Twenty
 Years of age and the said trustee so aforesaid shall proceed to elect and by a majori-
 ty of Votes appoint the person or persons so nominated to fill such Vacancy or the
 Vacancies in order to keep up the number of Trustees for ever: and in case of an
 equal number of Votes for and against the said nomination the Stationed Min-
 ister or Preacher shall have the Casting Vote provided nevertheless that the said
 trustees or any of them or their successors have advanced or shall advance any
 sum or sums of money, in account of said premises, and they the said trustees or
 their successors be obliged to pay the said sums of Money they or a majority of them
 shall be authorized to raise the said sum or sums of Money by Mortgage on the
 said premises or by selling the said premises after notice given to the pastor or
 preacher that has the care of the congregation attending divine services on the
 said premises if the money due be not paid to the said trustees or their successors
 within one Year after such notice given. And if such sale take place the said
 trustees or their successors after paying the debt and other expenses which are due
 from the money arising from such sale shall deposit the remainder of the money
 produced by the said Sale in the hands of the Steward or Stewards of the society
 belonging to or attending divine Service on said premises which surplus of the produce
 of such Sale so deposited in the hands of the said Steward or Stewards shall be at the
 disposal of the next Annual Conference authorized as aforesaid, which said
 Annual Conference shall dispose of the said Money according to the best of their
 Judgment for the use of the said Society, and the said Cooper Bartlett Seal his wife doth
 by these presents warrant and forever defend all and singular the above men-
 tioned and described lot or piece of ground with the appurtenances thereto belonging
 unto them the said Peter Bartlett James Collins Nathaniel White, Jacob Weston
 and Perry Hurlkins and their successors chosen and appointed as aforesaid from
 the claim or claims of him the said Cooper Bartlett his heirs and assigns on

from the claim or claims of all persons whatsoever. In Testimony whereof the said

year aforesaid.

Where there is a religious society or congregation of Christians, consisting
of fifteen or more persons, worshipping at the Church situated on the
public road leading from Dover to Barrons Corner, in West Dover
hundred, West County and State of Delaware;

And whereas notice, as required by law, was duly given by advertise-
ments posted at the front door of the Church aforesaid, ten days
prior to the twenty-first day of December A.D. 1919, for the purpose
of electing trustees for said religious society or congregation of
Christians, worshipping at said Church, to the end that said re-
ligious society might become incorporated under the laws of the
State of Delaware.

And whereas at the meeting held at said Church and place

of worship on said twenty-first day of December, A. D. 1919, at eleven o'clock A. M. Walter W. Cooper was appointed Chairman and John W. Fisher, Secretary, and the majority of said religious society or congregation of Christians did, in due form of law, elect the following trustees for said religious society, namely:

Now therefore, we, Samuel John, Sr., James Scott, Alongo Dale, Eduard Source and John W. Fisher, Trustees elected on the said twenty-first day of December, A. D. 1919, do hereby certify to the Recorder of Deeds of the State of Delaware, in and for Kent County, that said religious society or congregation of Christians consists of fifteen or more persons;

That the name or title of said corporation taken, adopted and authorized at said meeting is "Barbale African Methodist Episcopal Church."

And we do further certify to the said Recorder that the name of the said corporation is "Barbale African Methodist Episcopal Church."
