## EXPLANATION

The STATUS OF A STUDENT who withdraws from the college touches one of the following categories:

1. In Good Standing.....voluntary withdrawal or graduation.
2. On Probation.....poor scholarship.
3. Dropped.....unable or unwilling to do college work.
4. Suspended.....for cause, usually disciplinary—must reinstate.
5. Expelled.....serious breach of community ethics.

ENTRANCE UNITS refer to what subjects were acceptable from the high school transcript presented. The term "unit" meaning here that this value is awarded when 120 clock hours of work are devoted to a given subject. The work is usually scheduled for four or five days per week, for not less than forty-minute periods and from thirty-six to forty weeks per school year. Two periods of laboratory or shop practice count as one recitation.

A student is ADMITTED to the college as unconditioned, unclassified or as a special student.

An **unclassified** student fails to meet full entrance requirements.

A **special** student is an adult or a degree-holding student who was in the college, at the time, for purposes other than qualifying for a degree.

COLLEGE CREDITS—A semester hour is the credit allowed for each one-hour recitation or lecture which requires two hours of preparation or for the equivalent of a shop or laboratory period during each of the eighteen weeks of a semester.

The MARKING SYSTEM—A, Excellent; B, Good; C, Fair; D, Poor; F, Failure;

H, Credit for regular attendance only but without final examination;  
Wd, Withdrew from course;

N, No credit; I, Incomplete.
