

In Senate Jan^y 20. 1807
Amendments proposed by Senate to the bill entitled
"An Act for the division of the real estate of Warner
Mifflin dec^d of Elizabeth Mifflin dec^d and of lands held
by the children of the said Warner & Elizabeth &c -

Agreed to. In the Fifty first line of the preamble strike out the word
"appears" after the word "it" and insert in lieu thereof the
words "is represented" -

Agreed to. Add to the fourth section the following - "and in case
the said Court shall not approve of said return, then it
shall and may be lawful for said Court from time
to time to order and direct the said freeholders ^{named}
in this Act or any other five disinterested freeholders of
the said county to make partition or division of
the lands specified herein according to the directions
and provisions of this Act, until a return shall be
made and approved of by said Court."

Agreed to. Add the following section ~~as the seventh~~ "Sect 7 And
be it enacted by the authority aforesaid that if the said
commissioners or any one or more of them shall neglect
or refuse to perform the services required of them by
this Act, or if any one or more of the said commis-
sioners shall die before the division of the real estate

mentioned in this act shall be made, it shall and may
be lawful for the Orphans Court of the County of Kent
on the application of the said Anne Mifflin, Clayton
Cawgill, Warner Mifflin, Sarah Mifflin and Thomas
Rasin or any one or more of them, to appoint some
other freeholder or freeholders of the County of Kent
to act in the place and stead of such commissioner or
commissioners, neglecting ~~or~~ refusing or dying as aforesaid.
and such freeholder or freeholders so appointed by
the said Orphans Court shall have full power and
authority to do and perform all such acts and things
as the commissioner or commissioners in whose stead
or steads such freeholder or freeholders shall be
appointed might or could have done by virtue
of this act, and shall be entitled to the same com-
pensation"
