

An Act to divide Dover Hundred in Kent County into two Hundreds to be called respectively East Dover Hundred and West Dover Hundred.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Delaware in General Assembly met

Section 1. That Dover Hundred in Kent County shall be and the same is hereby divided into two Hundreds for the purpose of holding the general and special elections the election of assessors and inspectors and for the appointment of Constables and for such other purposes as may be necessary to constitute the respective Hundreds separate and distinct Hundreds with the rights that may properly appertain to them as such. All that part of said Dover Hundred now embraced in Dover East Election District shall constitute one Hundred of Kent County and shall be called and known by the name of East Dover Hundred and all that part of Dover Hundred now embraced in Dover West Election District shall constitute one Hundred of Kent County and shall be called and known by the name of West Dover Hundred and all laws of this state that apply to Hundreds in Kent County as such shall apply and extend to the said Hundreds respectively as separate and distinct Hundreds.

Section 2. That East Dover Hundred and West Dover Hundred as formed by this act shall each have one of the Commissioners of the Levy Court and Court of Appeals and one Constable each which under existing laws

Dover Hundred as it existed before the passage of this act was entitled
 to and at the next general election in this state one Levy Court Com-
 missioner shall be elected for each of said Hundreds or at such
 time as the legal terms of the present Commissioners shall expire
 and the Levy Court of Kent County upon the expiration of the
 term of office of the Constable at present residing in East Dover
 Hundred may appoint a constable for said East Dover Hundred
 to serve for the full term now fixed by law and the said
 Levy Court may appoint a constable for West Dover Hundred to
 serve the full term now fixed by law provided that nothing herein
 contained shall be construed to apply to or in any way affect any
 constable appointed under any special law residing within the
 limits of either Hundred. The Levy Court aforesaid shall appoint
 at the time now fixed by law for the appointment of Trustees of
 the Poor one Trustee of the Poor for each of said Hundreds.

Section 3. That all general and special elections and all elections
 for assessors and inspectors shall be held in the said Hundreds
 of East Dover and West Dover at the places now designated by law
 for holding elections in Dover East Election District and in Dover West Election
 District.

Section 4. That the assessment and collection of taxes in said Hun-
 dreds hereby formed out of what has heretofore been Dover Hundred

shall until the next general assessment of real and personal property be made in the same manner as heretofore and the payment of the taxes assessed under the present valuation shall have the same effect and force in all respect as the payment of taxes has or can have in any Hundred of the County and the passage of this act shall in no way impair the right of any Collector to complete the collection of duplicates or assessments in his hands for collection or which may hereafter be placed in his hands for collection in the same manner as if this act had not been passed but such collection or collectors their executors or administrators and the sureties of any such collector shall have the same powers rights and remedies and be under the same liabilities to collect the taxes committed to such collector for collection as if this act had not been passed.

Section 5: That the Constables and Trustees of the Poor heretofore appointed for Dover Hundred shall continue in office and act as such until their respective terms of office shall expire or become vacant.

An Act to Amend an Act Entitled And an Act to Divide East-Dover Hundred into two Election Districts passed at Dover April 10 1885.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Delaware in General Assembly met,

Section 1. Strike out all of Section 1 of the Act entitled an Act to Divide East-Dover Hundred into ~~two~~ Election Districts after the figure 1 in the first line of said Section and insert the following to wit. That for the purpose of holding Elections for State and County officers in East-Dover Hundred the said Hundred shall be divided into two Election Districts by the following line viz. Beginning at a point in the Public Road leading from Dover to Hazletville where the dividing line between East-Dover Hundred and West-Dover Hundred intersects said public road at or near John Slaughter's Gate thence running with said public road to the limits of the town of Dover and continue with North Street of the Town of Dover to State Street in said Town of Dover thence running in a northerly direction with State Street

in the Town of Owen to the mill pond formerly known
 as Shakespears Mill Pond thence up the westerly side of said
 pond and up Fork Branch to the Delaware Railroad thence
 in a northerly direction up said Railroad to the dividing
 line between Little Creek Hundred and East Lower Hundred
 All that part of said Hundred East of said dividing line
 which runs from the corner of State street and North street
 to the dividing line of East Lower Hundred and Little Creek
 Hundred and all that part of said East Lower Hundred
 which lies south of said North street in the Town of
 Owen and south of said ~~public~~ ~~road~~ ~~from~~ ~~Owen~~ ~~to~~ Hazlettsville shall
 be called Election District No 1 East Lower Hundred and
 all that part of East Lower Hundred which lies west of
 said line which runs from the corner of North street to
 the line dividing East Lower Hundred and Little Creek
 Hundred and all that part of said East Lower Hundred
 which lies north of said North street and north of said
 Public road from Owen to Hazlettsville shall be called Election
 District No 2 East Lower Hundred. The Election for District
 No 1 shall be held at the State House in the Town of
 Owen and the Election for District No 2 shall be

held in the town of Dover at the Brick School House
on Governors Avenue unless otherwise ordered by the Levy
Court of Kent County.

Section 2 This Act shall not apply to the Election to be
held on the nineteenth day of May A.D. 1891. in relation
to the calling of a Constitutional Convention.
