When the act incorporating the town of Farmington was approved March 15th 1909 the population was 166 the population Mar 1 1919 was 91 with eight unoccupied residence the same stores - carrying groceries in 1909 were carry so limited a variety & quality that town folk & farmers go to Hockley, Greenwood & Milford to do the bulk of their buying - The Levy Court appropriation of \$200 per acre amounts to \$2,000 about 1000 to 1200 taxes have been collected if any levy of taxes for 1918 tax-payers have not been presented with a bill - there has been a very few action in handling the more than three thousand dollars need for Levy Court & Tax we have never had any Police protection from hard cider rowdyism in fall - we have not had street lights since last August & for more than two years since town was incorporated a damage suit against the town so very poor world substance tax payers notwithstanding conditions W.W. Day a. S. Kirk & G. W. Langford of the Town Commissioners schemed to have Senator Murphy secure \$4000 from Levy Court & this likely to contract for Electric lighted streets which costs would be \$75 per month - I have a petition signed by more than twenty tax payers asking a repeal of the 1909 incorporation act - sent the paper to my brother ex-judge Walter H. Powell in Dover, he returned it after the Senator Murphy bill was sent in and the "Ripper" bill was killed the House took up the Senator Murphy bill - clipping hemmet - your veto very much will be the right thing
