LODGE HISTORY

The present Union Lodge #7 had its charter revived on June 27, 1857 by Grand Master Alfred P. Robinson, naming James P. Wild - Worshipful Master, William Shark - Senior Warden, and John A. Nicholson - Junior Warden, after remaining dormant for a period of twenty-three years. They first met in the old brick academy on State Street where their predecessors had met during their existence from 1809 until 1834.

After the first year they moved north on State Street to the Dunning Building where they met for twenty-seven years. During this period only sixteen men served as Worshipful Masters. In 1885 the lodge moved to 22 Loockerman Street where they continued to meet until 1927, at which time they moved back to State Street in the Hinkle Building where they remained until the present temple on South Street was completed in 1960. In the not too distant future Union Lodge will make still another move, this time to a location in the western part of Dover, where the lodge will have room to grow in an area of growth in the city. Over a 146-year period Union Lodge No. 7 is privileged in having 13 Grand Masters called from their ranks to serve the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Delaware.*

The first Union Lodge No. 7, Ancient York Masons, was chartered on June 24, 1809 with Willard Hall as charter Worshipful Master. Brother Hall was born in Massachusetts in 1780 and, after graduating from Harvard Law School, came to Delaware on horseback in 1803. He served as Secretary of State, Congressman and State Senator before being appointed a federal judge by President James Monroe in 1823. He continued to serve in this position for forty-eight years, retiring in 1871 at the age of ninety-one.

Judge Hall was best known as "the father of our state school system" on the basis of establishing the 1829 school system law which divided the counties into school districts with legal authority in the qualified voters of each district to establish and maintain free schools. Each district was to receive a fair share of state funds upon the condition that they raise local funds; thus, the taxpayers were responsible for the quality of education received in their local school system.

Brother Hall, having served Union Lodge as Worshipful Master twelve times (six-month terms), went on to be elected Junior Grand Warden in 1809 and 1810 and Grand Master in 1817 and 1818. By this time the Grand Lodge of Delaware was composed of nine lodges with a total membership of 291. Due to the Morgan Affair, Union Lodge became dormant in about 1833 but during a twenty-three year period their ten charter members had "brought to light" forty-four who went on to distinguish themselves in honor and service to our Fraternity.

Masonic Light first came to Dover on August 26, 1775, when Lodge No. 18 became the third to be chartered by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania in the state of Delaware. During their twelve-year history they met at the "Sign of General Washington", an inn which stood on the Green until it was destroyed by fire in 1863, where the Kent County Courthouse now stands. Between 1775 and 1787, 106 men were made Masons with at least twenty of their members serving as officers in the American Revolution, a claim which few Masonic lodges can equal.

A few of these Masonic patriots were Colonel David Hall, whose regiment saw action in six major battles before he was able to return to become charter Worshipful Master of Lodge No. 63 in Lewes and Governor of Delaware; Captain Jonathan Caldwell of the Company of Blue Hen Chicks with their famous fighting cocks; Captain Robert Kirkwood, who risked his life in thirty-three battles before making the supreme sacrifice for his country; Captain James Tilton, surgeon, who saved the Continental Army from a typhus fever epidemic, later to become Surgeon General in the War of 1812. But the greatest patriot of all was Captain Allen McLane of whom General George Washington remarked: "I would not do without him in the Light Corps - no, not for a thousand pounds."

Thus, during the past two centuries of our nation's history, the brethren of Dover have endeavored to uphold their responsibility in projecting their Masonic Image to their community, state and nation.

WILLARD HALL, PGM

Willard Hall was the charter Worshipful Master of the original Union Lodge #7 when it was chartered on June 24, 1809.

Judge Hall served Union Lodge as Master twelve times (six-month terms) and went on to be elected Grand Masters in 1817 and 1818, the first to serve from this Lodge.

During his term as Grand Master, the first Masonic patents or certificates of membership were issued and the charter of Union Lodge No.8 at Port Penn was suspended. He also gained the approval of the State Legislature to conduct a \$15,000 lottery for the construction of a new Masonic Hall at the Wilmington College Building in the 800 block of Market Street in Wilmington.

JOHN A. NICHOLSON, PGM

In 1865, John A. Nicholson, the charter Junior Warden of the present Union Lodge #7, became the second Grand Master from Union Lodge to serve in that office. During his term he introduced a resolution admonishing Robert Morris for his compilation of the Webb-Preston work. Despite this action, Past Grand Master Robert Morris of Kentucky addressed the Brethren of Union Lodge #7 on August 3, 1874 and held a public meeting in the Methodist Church Hall the following day. Morris is probably best remembered as the founder of the Order of Eastern Star before he was finally repudiated as a Mason.

Grand Master Nicholson also granted the charter for Hiram Lodge No.21 at Seaford and continued the dispensation of Felton Lodge U.D. for another year. In an attempt to ensure uniform work in Delaware, he requested the Grand Secretary to invite the Grand Lecturer of Maryland to visit the next session of Grand Lodge. He also directed that each lodge be required to pay ten per cent of the initiation fee, rather than the usual three dollars, to the Grand Lodge and recommended that the Grand Master visit every lodge at least once during his term of office.

JOHN F. SAULSBURY, PGM

The third Grand Master from Union Lodge No.7, John F. Saulsbury, elected in 1882, had the honor of serving two terms. He was re-elected in 1883. He dedicated the new halls of both Armstrong Lodge No.26 at Newport, and Hiram Lodge No.21 at Seaford. It was during his term that Felton Lodge No.22 finally became dormant as

the result of a fire burning them out. He advocated a uniform ritual and the establishment of Masonic libraries by each Lodge. He also authorized \$200 to purchase new Grand Lodge Officer Jewels and directed the old ones be returned to the Grand Secretary.

ELDAD L. CLARK, PGM

Eldad L. Clark in 1893 became the fourth Grand Master from Union Lodge. He, like Past Grand Master Nicholson, never served as Deputy Grand Master, but served as Senior Grand Warden as well as Worshipful Master in 1887. He commended the Brethren for the establishment of a Grand Lodge library and on the newly renovated lodge room in Wilmington's Masonic Temple. He reported on the success of the Lodge of Instruction which was conducted there each Saturday night. He recommended that in order to secure a competent Foreign Correspondent a salary of \$50 should be paid annually, even though the price of the Past Grand Master's jewel was now \$25.

GEORGE MASSEY JONES, PGM

In 1901, George Massey Jones became the fifth Grand Master from Union Lodge. He expressed satisfaction with the uniform work being done in District 1, but was concerned over that being employed in both Districts 2 and 3. During his term of office, a petition was first introduced for a new lodge at Millville which was rejected due to a minor irregularity. Finally in 1903 Doric Lodge No.30 was chartered.

HENRY I. BEERS JR., PGM

Henry I. Beers, Jr. became the sixth Grand Master from Union Lodge with his election in 1908. During his term in office, Brother Beers laid the cornerstone of Cedar Heights Chapel at Brandywine Springs and attended the Conference of Grand Masters which was held in Philadelphia. He also had the distinction of being the guest of the Grand Lodge of Ohio on the occasion of the President-election, William Howard Taft, being made a Mason at sight. Brother Beers also instituted the use of Grand Lodge aprons by the Grand Lodge Officers as well as the use of standardized forms by all of Delaware's twenty-two lodges.

HARRY MAYER, PGM

In 1919, Harry Mayer became the seventh Grand Master from Union Lodge. He dedicated the new Masonic Hall of Union Lodge No.5 at Middletown and also attended the first annual meeting of the Masonic Service Association which was held in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He also issued the order for removing the remains of Delaware's first Grand Master, Gunning Bedford, Jr., and those of his family from Wilmington's First Presbyterian Cemetery to be re-interred at the Masonic Home of Delaware. It was also Brother Mayer's recommendation that an addition be made to our Masonic Home to provide for an infirmary for the guests, which he felt was long overdue.

J. WALLACE WOODFORD, PGM

The eighth Grand Master from Union Lodge was J. Wallace Woodford in 1931, who would eventually become known as "Mr. Mason" in Delaware. Brother Woodford attended the 200th anniversary of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania and participated in the dedication of the George Washington Masonic National Memorial. His great concern for Masonic education is evidenced by his recommendation that Carl Claudy's 3-volume set, "Introduction to Freemasonry" be presented to each candidate, a practice which continued until recent years, ended by the end of publication of the volumes. Brother Woodford holds the distinction of having laid the cornerstone of eight public schools, a post office and a church, a record that may never be equalled.

J. ALLEN FREAR, JR., PGM

J. Allen Frear, Jr. became the ninth Grand Master from Union Lodge when he was elected in 1949. During his term of office, the cornerstone of Hiram Lodge No.25 Masonic Temple in Newark was laid and Ionic Lodge No.31 was chartered at Newport, the first new lodge to be chartered in forty-seven years. He was honored by being chosen as the speaker at the Conference of Grand Masters in Washington, D.C., his subject being "A Legislator Looks At Freemasonry". During his term, the Orville H. Peets oil portrait of Delaware's first Grand Master, Gunning Bedford, Jr., which now hangs in the Grand Master's suite, was presented to the Grand Lodge. It was his recommendation that a letter of good standing be issued, rather than a demit being issued, before a Brother affiliated with another lodge, a practice which continues today.

JOHN J. MCCLEARNEN, PGM

The year 1969 saw John J. McClearnen become the tenth Grand Master from Union Lodge. During Brother McClearnen's term of office, cornerstones were laid for both the Delaware State Police Academy in Dover and the new Masonic Temple of Gethsemane Lodge No.28 in Reliance, which he also dedicated. He continued to

strengthen the Masonic education of the candidate by instituting the Intender Program through the Committee on Education and Leadership, which is now mandated by the Grand Lodge Code.

JAMES H. HUTCHINS. PGM

The eleventh Grand Master to serve from Union Lodge is James H. Hutchins, who was elected in 1978. He laid the cornerstone of the Kent County Administration Building and consecrated a new daylight lodge, High Noon Lodge No.38 at Newport. He also provided for plural membership as well as modified the admission policies of Delaware's Masonic Home. During his term of office he raised over \$4,000 among his Delaware brethren for the Masonic Service Association to assist the victims of the Mississippi flood and was also elected vice-chairman of the Conference of Grand Masters of North America at their meeting in Colorado Springs, Colorado. He was the charter Worshipful Master of the Delaware Lodge of Research when it began in 1976.

THOMAS H. COUGHLIN, PGM

The twelfth Grand Master of Masons in Delaware to hail from Union Lodge is Thomas H. Coughlin. He was made an honorary citizen of the City of Lewes by then-Mayor Alfred Stango, a Mason, and was presented with a Kentucky Colonel membership by the Governor of Kentucky. The Bicentennial of the United States Constitution was celebrated during his term, and an original dramatization, "The Architects of Freedom", was presented in the Scottish Rite Cathedral. Brother Coughlin laid the cornerstone for the new Masonic Temple of Brandywine Lodge No.33 at Wilmington. He also issued an edict authorizing a Mason to make a "neutrally worded approach" to a non-Mason.

P. DONALD CAREY, PGM

The thirteenth and most recent Grand Master of Masons in Delaware from Union Lodge. His term ended in October 2003. While serving as Grand Master, M.W. Carey continued his many years of service to Union Lodge by continuing as lodge Treasurer. Brother Carey held the first-ever Grand Master's Charity Ball, and oversaw efforts to help the financial situation of Highfield, our Masonic Home, as well as the continued implementation of a Grand Lodge Permanent Fund that will go toward ensuring that our Grand Lodge is able to continue programs that will be necessary to the continued growth of Freemasonry in Delaware.
