

Senate Joint Resolution providing for a Joint Committee of both Houses to investigate and make report on the advisability of erecting a new State House and its location.

Be it Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Delaware in General Assembly met:

That a Joint Committee of two on the part of the Senate and three on the part of the House be appointed by the respective presiding officers of the Senate and House, whose duties it shall be to investigate and make report on the advisability of erecting a new State House and its location, and the probable cost thereof. The said Joint Committee is hereby directed to report as above as speedily as possible.
