

To the honorable the General Assembly of the State  
of Delaware.

The Memorial of Joshua Gilpin  
Executor of the Estate of Thomas Gilpin late of Phila-  
delphia deceased.

Respectfully sheweth.

That the said Thomas Gilpin in his Life-time, and in the  
year 1777. was possessed of sundry Black Cattle on the  
Meadows near Wilmington in this State — that in the  
Month of September in the year aforesaid, the said Cattle  
were taken from the said Meadows by George Evans  
then public Commisary, by virtue of orders from the  
President of the State of afterwards in the Month of November  
following by virtue of further Orders from the Vice  
President & Council of the State the said Cattle were  
sold by the said George Evans of the Money retained  
by him subject to the Orders of the General Assembly  
— That your Memorialist on behalf of the Estate of the said  
Thomas Gilpin having made application as well to  
the said George Evans as to all other persons concerned  
on this behalf finds, that he has no recourse but to  
the Justice of the State; being barred from all claim  
against its Officers in their individual Capacity  
both by the said Cattle having been originally taken  
from by the Officers of the State acting under the  
immediate Orders of by a certain Law or Laws en-  
acted since the Revolution confirming the conduct  
of such Officers & protecting them from prosecution  
or injury for the same.

Your Memorialist therefore humbly appren-  
ding that the Estate of the said Thomas Gilpin hath  
a just claim upon this State for payment for the  
aforesaid Cattle, but by their having been originally  
taken

or its use by its Officers & secondly by the State having removed all possibility of expense or payment from any other person or by any other mode of thereby virtue  
ally assumed the ~~restation~~<sup>restation</sup> of the demand itself humbly  
pray that you will take the premises into considera-  
tion & grant such Relief as your Wisdom & Justice  
may seem proper
