then my said Real Estate as it is before described shall
Descend to my three younger sons (viz) Isaac Nicholas &
Samuel to be equally divided amongst them three and
share alike to hold to them and their Heirs

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Isaac the full sum
Two Hundred pounds lawfull money of this Government
to be paid him by my son Peter out of my Real
Estate when he my said son Isaac shall come of age
in full for his part of my Estate

Item I give and devise unto my son Nicholas all my
Lands and Real Estate lying on the East side of the
Grate Road leading from Christiana Ferry to the
Town of Newcastles bounded by the Lands of John
Malcolm Sigfrudis Alricks William Bedford and
the Kings Road ~~also~~ supposed to contain Eight Acres
more or less to hold to him my said son Nicholas and
his Heirs forever I also give and Bequeath unto my
said son Nicholas the sum of One Hundred and
Fifty pounds lawfull money of this Government to
be paid him by my afor. son Peter out of my Real
Estate heretofore devised to him in full for his parts
of my Estate when he shall come of age

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Samuel the full
sum of Two Hundred pounds lawfull money of this
Government to be paid him by my son Peter out of
of my Real Estate, and the further sum of Thirty
pounds to be paid him by my Executors hereafter
named out of my personal Estate in full for
his part of my Estate when he shall be of age

Item I give and Bequeath unto my six Daughters (viz)
Mary Susan Elizabeth Doreas Catherine & Rebecca
all the residue of my personal Estate to be equally divided
amongst them three and share alike, excepting

In the name of God Amen I Peter Jaquet of the
Hundred and County of Newcastle on Delaware Hus-
band man being Sick and weak in Body but of sound mind
and Memory, and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men One to Die
do Constitut and ordain this my Last Will and Testament
Truly Trusting in the merits of my Redeemer for a
Joyfull Resurrection when Time shall be no more

First it is my Will that my Body shall be Decently
Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter
named, And Touching such worldly Estate wherewith
hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give
and Dispose of in the following way and manner

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Beloved wife Elizabeth
over and above her Dowry in my Real Estate the Sum of
One Hundred Pounds Lawfull money of this Government
also one Feather Bed and Furniture a more commonly
called Fly with one Cow and Calf and the Side Saddle
which she usually rode on these particulars of my
Personal Estate to hold to her her Heirs and Assigns

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Ann the wife
of George Clark all the goods and money which she
hath heretofore had of me Consisting of a Feather Bed
a Riding Chair and a Negro Girl named Jall and
the further Sum of Twenty Five pounds to be paid her
by my Executors hereafter named to hold to her my said
Daughter Ann and her Heirs and Assigns in full for her
part of my Estate

Item I give and Devise unto my eldest son Peter Jaquet all
my Real Estate commonly called Long Hook lying between
the west side of the grate Road leading from Christiana
Ferry to Newcastle and Christiana Creek to hold to him my

my three youngest Daughters and it is further my Will and
I do hereby give and Bequeath them over and above their
Equal Share in my personal Estate the following Sums of Money
(viz) to my Daughter Dorcas the Sum of Ten pounds To my
Daughter Catherine the Sum of Fifteen pounds to my Daughter
Rebecca the Sum of Twenty pounds and it is further my Will
that in Case any of my aforesaid Children should Die before
they come of Age that such Childs Share and portion of my
Estate shall Descend to my other Surviving Children to be
divided Equally amongst them. - And it is further my Will
that each of my Children shall Receive the Interest of
the several Legacies and Bequests made to them during their
minority to be applied Towards their Support and Education
from one year after my Decease -

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my Wife Elizabeth
and my son Peter to be the whole and sole Executors of this my
Last Will and Testament, Reserving and Disannulling all
and every other Will and Wills by me heretofore made
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
Last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty eighth
Day of October in the Year of our Lord One Thousand
Seven Hundred and Seventy Two

 Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief of the Counties of *New-Castle, Kent*
 and *Suffex, Delaware*, in the just and full Sum of *One Thousand*
Pounds current lawful Money of
America, to be paid to the said *Richard Penn Esq.* his lawful
 Attorney, Heirs and Successors; To the which Payment well and truly to be made,
 We bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally
 by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals. Dated this *Seventeenth*
 Day of *November* Anno Domini, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty Two*

THE CONDITION of this Obligation is such, That if the above Bounden
Elizabeth Jaquet Widow & Peter Jaquet Junr.

Goods, Rights and Credits of *Peter Jaquet the elder of Longhook York,*
 in *New-Castle County* aforesaid, deceased, do make, or
 cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory, of all and singular the Goods, Rights
 and Credits, which were of the said Deceased at the Time of his Death, which shall
 come to the Hands and Possession of *them* the said *Elizabeth & Peter*

them and the same do exhibit into the Register's Office at *New-Castle* aforesaid,
 on or before the *Seventeenth* Day of *May*
 next, ensuing the Date hereof, and the same do well and truly administer according
 to Law, and further do make a just and true Account of the said Administration, on
 or before the *Seventeenth* Day of *November* which shall be in
 Year of our Lord, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty Three* and all the
 Residue of the said Goods and Chattels, Rights and Credits, which shall be found re-
 maining on the said Administration Account of the same being first examined and
 allowed by the Orphans Court of the County of *New-castle*, aforesaid, do deliver to
 such Person and Persons as the said Court, by their Decree or Sentence shall limit
 and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was
