MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS
TO THE "GENERAL ASSEMBLY."

CAMP MIDDLEBROOK, May 16th 1779.

Honoured Sir,

We the Subscribers now Officers in the Delaware Reg't. beg the favour of your returning our thanks to the Hon'ble the House of Assembly for the gratuity already confer'd on us, and also of informing the Hon'ble House that unless such provision be shortly made that will enable us to continue in the service, we have unanimously agreed to withdraw ourselves therefrom on the 20th day of July next, and in justice to our Country, and our own reputations, we give this notice that they may appoint others to fill our present stations:—

In a Remonstrance dated in October 27th 78 we gave them our reasons why such provision was necessary, therefore it needs not a repetition as their own reflections must be sufficient if they only consider the cause that made it requisite for to add to the allowance made by a former Assembly for the support of its members whilst on publick service and as the stipulation of our pay was prior to that affixed allowance, we are equally affected by the extravagancies of the times, and the depreciation of the Continental Currency, and undoubtedly our pay now is as insufficient to support us as Officers, as that allowance was to maintain them as Gentlemen and members; for experience has fully convinced us that such an additional support was and is absolutely necessary, and only wish to have their views extended to us who are acting for the Publick, and in a station that renders us as liable to expense, as those gentlemen that are hardly drawn from the sight of their farms.—

We likewise can assure the Honble House that it is not through the least dislike for the cause in which we are engag'd, nor for any lucrative views that we have come to the above resolution but are reduc'd to it by real necessity and only ask to be put on equal terms with Officers from other States; for if past Services entitle them to the favour, we undoubtedly have a right to a similar claim; and should we be oblig'd to withdraw ourselves from the service of our Country, it will be with the greatest reluctance,

I herewith beg leave to Present the account of my Expences to Camp, allso my accounts of the Purchases made for the Delaware Regiment, and of the money put into my hands for the same; which I hope will meet with the approbation of your Honourable Houses.

Together with Lieutt. McKannon's account of his Expences when Going to Camp with Soldiers Cloaths, and his Letter to me on that Head: Allso Lieutt. Roche's account for Delivering out the officers stores.

And Sir, as Like Expences must Frequently attend such service I shall be much obliged to the Honourable General Assembly, for their Directions concerning the same.

Most of the Hatts for the officers are Ready; but some of the Tradesmen are not willing to Receive their Pay as agreed; But want the money made equal to what it passed for when they made agreement.

I must beg leave to mention, That the Regiment being wholly Depending on the State for Every Article of Cloathing, for the ensuing year. That this is the season, both to Purchase and have them *made* to prevent our being obliged to Give every man his Price, or Run the Risque of Going without them. I hope therefor that the Honourable Houses of Assembly will Please to Give me the Necessary Orders, that I may be Enabled to Compleat so Essential a Work in Time.

DOVER, October 26th, 1780

Gentleman,

I herewith beg leave to Present to the Honourable Houses of Assembly an account of the Purchases of Cloathing for the Delaware Regiment made since my last in April.—The Scarcity of Cash has prevented my compleating the Officers Cloathing for the year 1779, and obliged me to get Goods on Credit for some of those Gentleman as they passed to the southward in lieu of a part of their Cloathing, and to Pay Cash to others;—The Prices being Calculated as I could then purchase at, and to get Watch Coats for some for the year 1780, which I have Paid out of the Cash last received.

Lieutt. Roche left with me One Hundred & Ninety Six Uniform Coats and ten Hatts much worn.—I delivered to Major Patton ten Coats for Recruits and four to Soldiers now come from Camp, which are all the Cloathing I have on hand.—Major Patton not having made a Return of the Cash I paid him by Order of the General Assembly, preventeth my Ascertainig what Stores it purchased; but I apprehend it must have compleated them for the month of January last.—

I purchased four Shirts, four pairs of Linen Overalls and two pairs of Shoes for two Soldiers who remain'd in the State, by Order of his Excellency the President—

I have enclos'd a list of the two Company's which came from the Southward including those left behind and shall leave the remainder to be made out by Capt. Jaquett as I am not so well acquainted with it perhaps as him.

As to the pay you expect to receive shortly, it will be very acceptable, should it come sooner or later.

Capt. McKennan I am sorry to inform you is in a very bad way with his arm, occasioned by the wound he receiv'd, it has swell'd to an amazing degree & verry shortly expects it to break out again likewise he's troubled with continual feavers, poor Me I am afraid it's a most over with him. haveing nothing worth communicating except my compliments to all the Gentlemen, I am,

Gentlemen

Having this Day settled my accounts with the Comete of your Honourable Houses, and having in my hands an Order for a much larger sum of money than appears Due to me upon settlement, think it best herewith to Return the same, and Request of your Honours to Grant me an Order, for the sum which appears Due to me

Sir/

The Minister at War has enform'd Capt Moore, & myself, that immediately on the Arrival of the Pennsylvania Troops (which will be in ten Days at farthest) our Detachment must march down to the Delaware State: the General likewise requested us, to enform your excellency, that Preparation might be made; & a Place appointed for our Reception—This Place is now much crowded, and in the course of a few Days there will be more Pennsylvanians' than the Barracks can possibly hold, consequently our Quarters must be very disagreeable; we shall therefore be extreably oblig'd to your Excellency, for your Orders as soon as possible.

Capt. Moore wuo presents this will enform your Excellency of every particular.

Sir

Your favour dated the 6th to hand Just now observe the contents, and Mrs. Hollands Situation. I bleive as you say, the acts I have and well know her Demand, but the Situation of the funds, in my oppinion was never in so bad away, as to promising an order on Mr Bryan I do not think I did.

The Situation of the Delaware Regt. & to the Public in my oppinion every method should be used to have them immediately dischargd and without some money to give them at that time, point the Issue &c—

The Commissary, that I employd. is now above £300, due him and says he must quit as his stock is run out sent him to Collo. Bryan for cash, his answer was he had none, nor expected none this 2 mo. I have since furnishd him to go on; with my own private cash for fear of the consequences. Mr. Vining has about £300 this I intend, for the Commissary and Mr. Perry, by last acets none. I must have £1200 for the Troops as being about 2 mo. pay to enable to discharge them and get up the Financirs notes, if that sum I had they should not remain 3 days as an expence, the paymaster may I sepose now, be also ready to settle with them next week, but for want of the cash, they will not be dischargd. Therefore on the above representation and within Mrs Holland must wait. and soon as that business is compleated she may depend on every thing in my power.
