Done, Jan 7. 18th 1833.

To the Speaker of the Senate,

I herewith present to the Senate, for the consideration of the General Assembly - a communication from the Governor of the State of South Carolina, enclosing certain resolutions of the Legislature of that State, for a convention of the States, to consider and determine questions of disputed power, between the States of this confederacy and the general government.

Also also resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, for the passage of a law by the Congress of the United States, to establish a more perfect organization of the Militia of the several States - and resolutions of the same General Assembly, upon the proclamation of the President of the United States.

I have received and deposited in the Office of the Secretary of State, for the use of the State - an Atlas of the State of New-York - a map of the State of Vermont -

and three copies of the fifth census, or enumeration of the inhabitants of the United States.
