PROVINCIAL OFFICERS AND SOLDIERS.

KING GEORGE'S WAR.

The Companies commanded by Captains Trent, Shannon, Deimer and Perry, were recruited under authority of a proclamation issued by Governor George Thomas, dated June 9, 1746, reciting the King's Order of the ninth of April, to raise four hundred men within the province of Pennsylvania, to be employed in concert with the regular forces in the immediate reduction of Canada.

The instructions for recruiting, together with a copy of Capt. Shannon's commission, will be found in Pa. Archives, First Series, Vol. 1, pages 688, 689. These companies went into winter quarters at Albany, N. Y., 1746-1747, and were finally discharged October 31, 1747, "the late intended expedition against Canada having been by his Majesty laid aside for the present."

(In December, 1747, the Assembly having made no provision for the defence of the City and Province, many of the inhabitants became alarmed and voluntarily entered into an association for defence. Companies were formed, which proceeded to choose officers, who in turn, assembled and chose their superior officers, all being commissioned by the direction of the Provincial Council. Col. Records, vol. V. pages 172, 174. The result of this movement is detailed in the message of Anthony Palmer, President, to the Assembly dated May 17, 1748: "The Province which very lately was in a defenceless state, is now, through the zeal and activity of some, who have the love of their country sincerely at heart, rendered capable, with the blessing of God, of defending itself against the designs of our enemies, many thousands of the inhabitants having voluntarily entered into the most solemn engagements for that purpose; in consequence whereof, arms have been provided, and every one appears assiduous in qualifying himself for the defence of his country. They have likewise at considerable expense, erected batteries on the River, so situated and of such strength and weight of metal, as to render it very dangerous for an enemy to attempt the bringing any ships before the city. We have granted commissions to such general and other officers, as have from time to time been presented to us for that purpose by the Association. Since these measures tend so

manifestly, under God, for the security of this Province, the preservation of its metropolis, we think they justly deserve the assistance and encouragement of your House."—Votes of Assembly, vol. IV, page 72.)

Your committee are also of the opinion that the resolution of Congress of the 27th of December, recommending the march of the new levies of this State for the Continental army, by companies or parts of companies be also complied with; and that it be recommended to the commanding officer of the Delaware Battalion to issue orders to the respective captains thereof to march their companies to Philadelphia, to receive further orders from the commanding officer there, and, if not yet complete, to cause so

many as may be already inlisted immediately to repair there, under a proper officer or officers, provided the number shall amount to thirty-five, leaving one or more officers to recruit, in order to fill up the companies and that a sum of money be provided for the subsistence of the the companies so marching till they arrive at Philadelphia, which, your committee think, will render the appointment of a commissary, to proceed there for the purpose of procuring provisions, unnecessary.

CAMP MIDDLEBROOK, May 16th 1779.

Honoured Sir,

We the Subscribers now Officers in the Delaware Reg't. beg the favour of your returning our thanks to the Hon'ble the House of Assembly for the gratuity already confer'd on us, and also of informing the Hon'ble House that unless such provision be shortly made that will enable us to continue in the service, we have unanimously agreed to withdraw ourselves therefrom on the 20th day of July next, and in justice to our Country, and our own reputations, we give this notice that they may appoint others to fill our present stations:—

In a Remonstrance dated in October 27th 78 we gave them our reasons why such provision was necessary, therefore it needs not a repetition as their own reflections must be sufficient if they only consider the cause that made it requisite for to add to the allowance made by a former Assembly for the support of its members whilst on publick service and as the stipulation of our pay was prior to that affixed allowance, we are equally affected by the extravagancies of the times, and the depreciation of the Continental Currency, and undoubtedly our pay now is as insufficient to support us as Officers, as that allowance was to maintain them as Gentlemen and members; for experience has fully convinced us that such an additional support was and is absolutely necessary, and only wish to have their views extended to us who are acting for the Publick, and in a station that renders us as liable to expense, as those gentlemen that are hardly drawn from the sight of their farms.—

We likewise can assure the Honble House that it is not through the least dislike for the cause in which we are engag'd, nor for any lucrative views that we have come to the above resolution but are reduc'd to it by real necessity and only ask to be put on equal terms with Officers from other States; for if past Services entitle them to the favour, we undoubtedly have a right to a similar claim; and should we be oblig'd'd to withdraw ourselves from the service of our Country, it will be with the greatest reluctance,

Most of the Hatts for the officers are Ready; but some of the Tradesmen are not willing to Receive their Pay as agreed; But want the money made equal to what it passed for when they made agreement.

I must beg leave to mention, That the Regiment being wholly Depending on the State for Every Article of Cloathing, for the ensuing year. That this is the season, both to Purchase and have them *made* to prevent our being obliged to Give every man his Price, or Run the Risque of Going without them. I hope therefor that the Honourable Houses of Assembly will Please to Give me the Necessary Orders, that I may be Enabled to Compleat so Essential a Work in Time.

I herewith beg leave to Present to the Honourable Houses of Assembly an account of the Purchases of Cloathing for the Delaware Regiment made since my last in April.—The Scarcity of Cash has prevented my compleating the Officers Cloathing for the year 1779, and obliged me to get Goods on Credit for some of those Gentleman as they passed to the southward in lieu of a part of their Cloathing, and to Pay Cash to others;—The Prices being Calculated as I could then purchase at, and to get Watch Coats for some for the year 1780, which I have Paid out of the Cash last received.

Lieutt. Roche left with me One Hundred & Ninety Six Uniform Coats and ten Hatts much worn.—I delivered to Major Patton ten Coats for Recruits and four to Soldiers now come from Camp, which are all the Cloathing I have on hand.—Major Patton not having made a Return of the Cash I paid him by Order of the General Assembly, preventeth my Ascertainig what Stores it purchased; but I apprehend it must have compleated them for the month of January last.—

I purchased four Shirts, four pairs of Linen Overalls and two pairs of Shoes for two Soldiers who remain'd in the State, by Order of his Excellency the President—

McKennan I am sorry to inform you is in a very bad way with his arm, occasioned by the wound he receiv'd, it has swell'd to an amazing degree & verry shortly expects it to break out again likewise he's troubled with continual feavers, poor Me I am afraid it's a most over with him. haveing nothing worth communicating except my compliments to all the Gentlemen, I am,

Your favour dated the 6th to hand Just now observe the contents, and Mrs. Hollands Situation. I bleive as you say, the acts I have and well know her Demand, but the Situation of the funds, in my oppinion was never in so bad away, as to promising an order on Mr Bryan I do not think I did.

The Situation of the Delaware Regt. & to the Public in my oppinion every method should be used to have them immediately dischargd and without some money to give them at that time, point the Issue &c—

The Commissary, that I employd. is now above .£300, due him and says he must quit as his stock is run out sent him to Collo. Bryan for cash, his answer was he had none, nor expected none this 2 mo. I have since furnishd him to go on; with my own private cash for fear of the consequences. Mr. Vining has about .£300 this I intend, for the Commissary and Mr. Perry, by last acct. none. I must have .£1200 for the Troops as being about 2 mo. pay to enable to discharge them and get up the Financirs notes, if that sum I had they should not remain 3 days as an expence, the paymaster may I sepose now, be also ready to settle with them next week, but for want of the cash, they will not be dischargd. Therefore on the above representation and within Mrs Holland must wait. and soon as that business is compleated she may depend on every thing in my power.

300 Non-commissioned Officers and Privates to be raised in New Castle County, and to consist of 6 Companies of 50 Men each, (Viz) 2 Sargeants, 2 corporals. 1 Drummer, 1 fifer, and 44 Privates, and to be commanded each Company by 1 Captain, 1 Lieutenant, and 1 Ensign. 200 Do. in Kent County—and 100 Do in Sussex County, to be officered in the same manner. The Captains in New Castle County appointed to this service are as follows, (viz) James Black, John James, Thomas Wattson, Isaac Lewis, William Moody and William Rankin.

Major General Rodney to appoint the 4 Captains in Kent County, and Brigadier Dagworthy is to appoint the 2 Captains in Sussex. Each of the 12 Captains is to have the Nomination of his own Sub-alterns.

The whole Corps to be commanded by 1 Brigadier General, 1 Lieutenant Colonel and 2 Majors. Names of said Officers, Brigadier Patterson, Lt. Colonel George Craighead, 1st. Major to be named by General Rodney, & 2 Do. by Brigadier Dagworthy—The Staff—Surgeon, Doctor William Patterson, who is to nominate his Mate. Adjutant, Matthew Aiken-Quarter Master, William Clark, Brother to the Sheriff, Commissary, William McClay.

GENERAL ORDERS for the DELAWARE STATE

The above Scheme is to be carried into Execution with the utmost Expedition; each Company in the respective Counties to furnish their Quota for such County, according to the Numbers in each Company, and if the Levies cannot be procured, any Volunteer from any place whatsoever to be received. Each Man to furnish himself with a musket &c. and a Blanket, and if any Arms or Blankets are wanting, they are to be taken, in the first place, from such persons as the several Captains shall think Disaffected or not well affected to the Independence of the State, and afterwards wherever they can be had—the Intention being in this decent manner to disarm our internal Enemies—All arms & Blankets thus procured to be valued by two judicious Freeholders, and a receipt for the same to be given to the owner mentioning such value; the private to whom such Arms &c. are delivered, is to return the same to his Captain on the Day of his Corps's Discharge, or to pay the appraised Value, for the use of the Owner.—Each Company as soon as it amounts to 40 Non-commissioned Officers and Privates in the County of New Castle, is to march instantly to the place of Rendezvous at the Town of Newark, and from the other Counties, at Middletown in New Castle County. All the rest of the Militia to be discharged, except Captain William Peery's Company in Sussex. If a guard should be desired by the General Assembly at Dover, whilst they sit, or should be thought necessary at any other time, it may be ordered by Majr. General Rodney.—The whole Corps to be paid monthly. All Officers civil and military are requested and directed to be Aiding and assisting in carrying these Orders into Execution, as they will answer the Contrary at their Peril.

From the Example of the States of Maryland, Virginia and Pennsylvania from which the Militia march'd to join General Washington, (at the time when Genl. Howe and the Army of the Enemy were in New-Castle County) in order to defend the County, it is impossible to suppose that the Inhabitants of the Delaware State can have so little Sense or so little Virtue, had they no regard to Law, as to decline

The Remonstrance and Petition of George McKindley Yeoman of New Castle County in State aforesaid humbly Sheweth—

That Whereas Your Petitioner on the twentieth Day of August Anno Dom. 1777. Did March with the Militia then Commanded by Captain Isaac Lewis Esq. of Pincader hundred and County aforesaid, to the head of Elk River in the Maryland State, and Whereas your petitioner, on the Twenty-fifth Day of August aforesaid, had the Misfortune to be taken prisoner by the British troops and by them Confined and kept untill the Eighteenth day of July Anno Dom. 1778. when he was Exchanged and came home on the thirty-first Day of said July, being eleven Months and eleven days absent from home. And Whereas your Petitioner hath not ever yet Received any pay or Reward for any part of the said time so absent which he, your petitioner, is very unable to bear.....

Therefore, please to take the Matter under Your honours Serious Consideration, and Grant and order such Relief and pay unto and for your said petitioner as to your honours may seem Meet to grant for the service and absent time aforesaid and your petitioner as in Duty Bound, Shall ever pray,—

The Board taking into Consideration the unhappy Situation of John McKinly, Esquire, late President of this State, captivated by a Detachment of the British Army in September 1777, at Wilmington, and now a Prisoner under a short Parole, to solicit his Exchange for William Franklin Esqr. late Governor of New Jersey; came to the following Resolution, to wit,

RESOLVED,

That it is the Opinion of this Board, That the said John McKinly, every since the Commencement of the present Contest between Great Britain and America, until his Captivity afsd., took a very active Part in Support of the Liberties of the latter, against the oppressive Measures of the former. That in the Execution thereof he fitted the several Offices of Chairman of the Committee of Inspection

and Observation for New Castle County, Coll. of a Battalion of Militia there, and Brigadier General, President of the Council of Safety, Speaker of the House of Assembly under the present Frame of Government, and lastly that of President and Commander in Chief of the State; and discharged the several Duties with attention Zeal, and Alacrity.

RESOLVED, therefore,

That the President do request the Delegates from this State in Congress to make immediate Application to that Honourable Body, That they would be pleased to take Order, in such Way as to them shall seem most proper, for the speedy Exchange of Mr. McKinly, as his public Services do certainly merit public Favour and Regard.

REMONSTRANCE OF OFFICERS

Camp Middlebrook, May 16th 1779.

Honoured Sir,

We the Subscribers now Officers in the Delaware Regt. beg the favour of your returning our thanks to the Honble the House of Assembly for the gratuity already confer'd on us. and also of informing the Honble House that unless such provision be shortly made that will inable us to continue in the service, we have unanimously agreed to withdraw ourselves therefrom on the 20th day of July next, and in justice to our country, and our own reputations we give this notice that they may appoint others to fill our present stations;—

In a Remonstrance dated in October 27th 78 we gave them our reasons why such provision was necessary, therefore it needs not a repetition; as their own reflections must be sufficient if they only consider the cause that made it requisite for to add to the allowance made by former Assembly for the support of its members whilst on publick Service; and as the stipulation of our pay was prior to that affixed allowance, we are equally affected by the extravagances of the times, and the depreciation of the Continental Currency, and undoubtedly our pay now is as insufficient to support us as officers, as that allowance was to maintain them as Gentlemen and Members; for experience has fully convinced us that such additional support was and is absolutely necessary, and only wish to have their views extended to us who are acting for the Publick, and in a station that renders us as liable to expense, as those gentlemen that are hardly drawn from the sight of their farms;—

We likewise can assure the Honble House that it is not through the least dislike for the cause in which we are engag'd, nor for any lucrative views that we have come to the above resolution but are reduc'd to it by real necessity, and only ask to be put on equal terms with Officers from other States; for if past Services entitled them to the favour, we undoubtedly have a right to a similar claim; and should we be obliged to withdraw ourselves from the Service of our Country, it will be with the greatest reluctance,

The disagreeable Situation of the Officers (Prisoners in the Field) must be obvious to every Gentleman of the House, when I assure them, that in our unfortunate Defeat to the Southward, our Baggage was lost, not one saving even a single shift of Clothes. In this Condition I left them expecting an immediate Relief from the State; none has yet been sent, owing to a want of Money, to make the Purchases; the Sooner this necessary Article could be procured, the Sooner Suffers will be relieved

Met in Council at New Castle January 25th Anno. Dom. 1781.

The Submissive Petition of us the Subscribers, Inhabitants of Whiteclay Creek Hundred in the County of New Castle and State afforsaid humbly sheweth—

That whereas in the year 1777, your Petitioners found themselves agrieved in the electing the Commissioned Officers in the upper End of Whiteclay Creek Hundred aforesd. as We apprehended that the Election was not held according to the Militia Law Enacted at that time for the regulating such Transaction, as there was neither lawful Notice given, nor the Person appointed by Law presiding in it. Whereupon We, together with some others who for, the same Reasons, thought themselves imposed on, immediately enrolled ourselves in another Company, where we have given punctual Attendance ever since, and when the safety of our County required it we testified our Loyalty by a chearful Obediance in actual Services. Now Sir we are fined for none attendance in Whiteclay Creek Company aforesd. and we think it very Grievous, and Oppressive, that after we have given lawful Attendance in one Company, we should be fined in another, AND Now Sir, we appeal to your Excellency and beg that we may have our Fines Taken off, and Liberty to remain in the Company we are in until a lawful Election may be had for Commissioned Officers in our own Hundred, and we your humble petitioners shall pray.

& know that he was not absent, nor missing from his stand next to me, the whole time, nor do I remember of seeing a stack of hay, or of anything else on the island. I well remember at the commencement of that action & several other times that day, to have heard Capt. Hall reprove some of his men for dodging at shot, he said it was of no use, or it did no good. He appeared to me that day to act without a symptom of fear, or cowardice, as indeed I have always esteemed a sober solid & intrepid man.—

I have heard that a certain first lieutenant of Captain Vaughan's company in the Delaware regiment, found in the course of that day a stack of flax, (but I did not see it) which thing was discovered, as (every such thing is among an army of soldiers), & for which he was disgraced, & left this company for fear of the consequences.—I mention this supposing the fabricator of the falsehood took his materials from that occurrence.

I am very certain Colonel Hall was universally esteemed at camp, by both officers, & private soldiers, for his steady, and regular, conduct, and intrepid manner.

PETITION OF PETER JAQUETT

Your Memorilest would respectfully State that he served in the Delaware Regiment attached to the Maryland line under orders of Gen'l Washington in the States of Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and the Eastern States, from the 4th. of January 1776 Until April 1780, and had an active part in all the actions fought during that time when, the Del. Regt. then consisting of eight Companies, commanded by Col. David Hall & attachd to the Maryland line, was ordered to S. Carolina Under the Command of Gen. H. Geats, and on the 16th of August of that year was defeated near Camden S. Carolina, and the Del. Reg. reduced from 8 to 2 Companies. In September the remains of the army where collected & randevoused at Hillsborough in N. Carolina under orders of Gen. Smallwood, Soon after Gen. Green took the Command, when it was found that the Del. Reg. could not muster more than 200 effective men, these by order of Gen. Green was placed under the command of Capt. Robert Kirkwood & Capt. Peter Jaquett as the two Sener Surviving Captains of the Del. Regt. with their Subaltern Officers forming two Companies of 96 men each—see the returns made and sent to the Executive of this State and now in the possession of Thos. Rodney Esq. dated Aug. 30 1780 and signed by Capt. Kirkwood & Jaquett, the field officers and all the other officers except Capts. KcKennon & Queenault, Lieut. Bennett & Hyatt were killed, wounded or prisoners—the four last named officers was sent to the Delaware State on the recruiting service—in October a small but badly supplied army was collected & organized and again took the feald under Gen. Green, who again Marched us into S. Carolina where after our Victory at the Cowpens we where again obliged to retreat before Gen. Lord Cornwallis to Gilford Court House in N. Carolina

where a sort of drawn action was fought, We however on the next day buried their dead by platoons in the yard of a Quaker Meeting House and left their wounded with our own in the care of the Surgens & Friends, took our final leave of his lordship one taking the rout to Yorke Town in Virginia, and we the route towards Charlestown in S. Carolina and fought the second action at Camden, the hard and well fought action at the Eutaw Springs, the fortified Court House & town of Ninety Six, fourt Augusta and several forts or fortified places we at length Coped the Enemy up in the City of Charlestown, in the mean time Gen. Washington met Gen. lord Cornwallis at Yorke town in Virginia and captured him, and soon after Gen. Washington sent Gen. Wain with a Brigade of the Pennsylvania line to the assistance of Gen. Green who arrived at Gen. Green's head quarters near Charlestown in February 1782 and with them Captains McKennon & Queenault with all the men they had recruited or collected for the Del. Regiment, who had assisted at the Capture of Cornwallis.

About this time the prolimnory articals of peace were signed and hostilities had seaced except a little scarmishing to prevent the Enemy from getting potatoes & rice which they much wanted as well ourselves.

Gen. Green well knowing the privations, fatigue and hardships that Capt. Kirkwood & myself had passed through during our Southern Campayns polightly offered to Send Us home on Command, with orders to the Comesery & Quartermasters Department to furnish us with provisions & forage at every Depot on the road. Capt. Kirkwood left Headquarters two days before me with a view of taking his rout as much as possible by water, and I began my march on the 20 Day february with 4 officers nine involied Soldiers, one woman, two waggons and nine Horses but unfortunately your memmorlist found nether provisions or forage in any of the public stores—it is known that the army had not received one cent of pay during all our Southern Campaigns, that Continental money had depreciated 100 for one—and we had a march of more than 500 miles to perform without our pay, rations, forage or one Dollar of the public money, and we could not obtain one single artical of Provision or forage on the whole route without the hard cash layed down, thus situated I did Pay from my own private resources \$168.45 as per account rendered of which I have never received one cent. at that time the United States was indebted to me Upwards of 3000 Dols. Exclusive of the sd. amount for pay, commutation of half pay, Depreciation of pay &c., which was afterwards Payed by giving a certificate which our wants obliged us to sell at a discount of 66 pr. sent—but as it is known that your memorlist had received no pay for the last two years and his patrimonial Estate at first was but very small & that small sum much reduced in the Revolutionary War, it may be asked where he got \$168.45 cents he answers that a Noble Harted Lady, a friend of the revolution, of respectable family and fortune furnished him all that money in English Gunies, at a time when he had scarsely a Shirt on his back, or means of getting one, or a shoe on his feet, without asking the scratch of a pen for its return, that Lady has long since decended to the tumb, but your memmorlist still holds himself in Honor bound to make retribution to her heirs—Your Memorlist therefore respectfully asks your Honorable boddy to give him the above sum with interest from the 20 of February 1782, and altho he is to old to fight, he will Pray.

Capt. McKennan & Queenault, Lieut C. P. Bennett & Hyatt with all the men &c. all these have decended to the tumb Except Lieut C. P. Bennett, who can

certify to the truth of the above statement—I believe there is not an officer now liveing who served in the Delaware Regiment through the Campaign of 1776, altho there had been more than 80 officers Commissioned and 3500 men inlisted in that regiment Except Yours

DELAWARE REGIMENT

TO THE EDITORS OF THE WATCHMAN.

Long Hook, near Wilmington Del. Dept. 10th, 1825

Gentlemen—I observe in your paper of the 6th inst. a communication from my old friend and fellow soldier, Major C. P. Bennett: in which he gives you a statement of the Delaware Regiment as organized in April, 1777; omitting the organization of that regiment in January 1776, under an act of the Legislature of this State, passed in 1775., ordering the officers to be commissioned and the soldiers to be enlisted for one year ending on the 31st. of December, 1776. I herewith send you a list of the Officers names, their commissions all bearing date from the first to the ninth day of January, 1776. I then received an ensigns commission, dated January 4th. 1776, in which capacity I served until January, 1777—when, by another act of the Legislature, the regiment was reorganized, and I received a Lieutenant's commission. After assisting to recruit a company under the gallant Capt. R. Kirkwood, I marched with them, in February, to Princeton and Brunswick, in New Jersey; at which time the enemy were in possession of a part of that State and of New York. By another act of the Legislature, the regiment was again reorganized in April, 1777, and I received a Captain's commission, dated January 8th 1777. In that capacity I served until near the close of the war, when I received a Major's brevet, dated June 8th 1782. The Delaware Regiment in the campaign of '76, consisted of 42 officers, and 768 rank and file. Of these, four officers, including the gallant Commander were killed, and sixteen wounded. Of the rank and file, many were killed and wounded—but more died of the camp fever. It is believed that but one or two officers survive, who were commissioned in January, 1776—assisted to raise the regiment and continued with it to the end of the war, or seven years and ten months.

At the close of this campaign, the enemy were not only in possession of the city of New York and the greater part of that State, but they occupied all the eastern seaports—had overrun New Jersey to the banks of the Delaware, and threatened our existence as a nation. A thick cloud of darkness and gloom had covered the land, and despair was seen in almost every countenance. More than one half of the officers of the regiment refused to serve the next campaign. This was truly a "Time that tried men's souls." There were, however, from January to April 1777, about forty choice spirits found, who accepted commissions, when it was reorganized

and the men enlisted for three years, or during the war—and in April took the field, under the command of Col. D. Hall and the officers as stated in the Watchman of the 6th inst. It is believed that in the course of the war there were upwards of 90 officers commissioned, and 5,000 soldiers enlisted, in the Delaware Regiment:—it is likewise believed that there are but two or three officers and three soldiers of that regiment now living, and two soldiers on the pension list. The State of Rhode Island had but one regiment in the Revolutionary War, which it is believed consisted of about 600 men: yet in the year 1820, Rhode Island had upwards of eighty officers and men on the pension list—whilst the State of Delaware had but three officers and men. How the Rhode Islanders should have escaped the ravages of war and time, in the proportion of 80 to 3, I am at a loss to determine: and sometime ago I addressed a note (a copy of which, I kept) to the Secretary of War, for further information. This note was enclosed to my friend, the late C. A. Rodney, Esq. who, I believe thought that some of my observations were too personal, and never delivered it to the Secretary

Sir

I have the pleasure to inform you, that the news of our success in South Carolina, is so far confirmed, tho we have not yet received any Express, as to put the truth of it beyond all doubt—The Enemy attacked our Lines at Charlestown, and were bravely repulsed—They attacked a second time, & while the action was well maintained on both sides, a column of Lincoln's army appeared in the rear of the Enemy, & immediately falling upon them put them to a total Rout, with a very great loss of kill'd & taken on the spot—and then pursued them as they were scattered in small parties to make their escape, which perhaps is the reason, that we have not yet had any Express from him. It is said, the enemy's numbers were 4000 British, & 3000 Tories, the latter of which made little or no resistance In short, tho the particulars cannot be authentically ascertained, Congress is convinced, that the affair is another Bourgoignade—and every successive Blow of that kind, must be more severely felt than the preceeding, because it is striking upon a Place already sore & weakened.

Let us at this important Crisis intensely recollect our duty to Heaven & our Country—co-operate in our several stations with the Efforts of our Gallant Brethern

Dear Mr. Tatnall:

I wrote you last Spring in regard to the Revolutionary record of my great grandfather, Capt. Peter Jaquett of Christiania Ferry, Del. You could not give me the information required, but said that the 3rd or 4th Vol. of the Delaware Archives would be published within the year and I might be able to obtain the needed information then. I would not like to have that volume go to press without giving the facts relating to the said Peter Jaquett.

There were two Captain Peter Jaquetts in the Revolutionary War (See reference in Scharf's History of Delaware, Vol. II, Page 857 according to the edition of Scharf found in the Library of Congress. One lived at Long Hook, one on Locust Farm. The first named was Capt. (later Major) of Infantry, and there are many references to him. The other, my ancestor, was a Capt. of Dragoons (Cavalry). He was a man of wealth, and organized his own independent company of Dragoons and accoutred them completely. He would not accept a pension and as his company was independent it would seem that there is no record, or else the record was burned in a fire of which Judge Gray of Delaware told my father. This Captain Peter Jaquett was a direct descendant of Jean Paul Jaquett, Colonial Governor of Delaware in 1654 under the Dutch Rule. The Governor had two sons. My Rev. ancestor was of the elder branch and his line lived in the "Mansion House" as it was called, for nearly two hundred years, or until my own father was about seven years old, 1841.

It has been suggested that my ancestor Capt. Peter Jaquett of the Dragoons, may have joined the Cavalry of Maryland,

so near at hand. According to tradition his friend and relative, Col. Isaac Grantham, fought side by side with him. If the record of the one could be found, the record of the other should be found, Otherwise it should be taken for granted that records of both were burned in the fire before mentioned.

A difficulty lies in fact that there were two Capt. Peter Jaquetts, neither having a middle name. But Capt. (later Major) Peter Jaquett of the Infantry was the elder and although he had no children, was known even in legal documents as Peter Jaquett, Senior, while Capt. Peter Jaquett, my ancestor, was known as Peter Jaquett, Junior, even in legal documents and yet he was the son of Thomas Jaquet. You will find both given in the Jaquett Genealogy by E. J. Sellers.

Your name is mentioned in this genealogy as a friend of Jaquetts and as one who befriended them after the Rev. War. I sincerely hope you, the descendant, will prove as great a friend of the present generation, by seeing that my ancestor's name is placed beside that of his famous Cousin, Major Peter Jaquett. As a Member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and of the Society of the Daughters of Founders and Patriots, I hope you will see that justice is done to the name of Capt. Peter Jaquett, Capt. of Cavalry, in your Archives.

Companies until Nov. 15, 1783, when he was honorably retired on disbandment of his command. The will of Major Peter Jaquett was dated June 18, 1834. He provides for a slab to be placed over the graves of his wife and himself and upon which was to be engraved, in addition to the usual dates, his Revolutionary services; he provides a sum for repairs of the old "Trinity Church House" in Wilmington and the stone wall around the churchyard; he bequeaths to his nephew Peter, son of his deceased brother Nicholas Jaquett, his Bible, containing births, marriages and deaths of the family; also his Revolutionary Diploma (of membership in the Cincinnati), signed by Generals Washington and Knox, and his two Revolutionary swords and musket; he makes bequests to Maria Jaquett, wife of Lawrence Greatrake, and her sister Sarah Jaquett, adopted daughters of his late wife; Mary Ann Greatrake, wife of Captain Roberts, and her sister Maria Greatrake, wife of Mr. Southerland, and Sarah Greatrake and Lydia Greatrake, daughters of Eliza Greatrake; his nephew Peter Jaquett, son of his deceased brother Nicholas Jaquett; to children of deceased sister Susan Alrich; to children of his deceased sister Dorcas Barr; to children of deceased sister Elizabeth Ruth; and to children of deceased brother Samuel. He appoints his nephews Peter S. Alrich and Peter Jaquett, Executors—Witnesses: James W. Thompson, William Gailey,

John M. Smith and James Sorden. Probated Sept. 16, 1834 (*Liber T*, p. 102). See 1st Ed. for full account of Major Jaquett. His portrait is reproduced from the original in possession of the family of Benjamin F. Methven, Esq., (452). "History of Delaware," by J. Thos. Scharf, p. 212: "On the South side of the Christiana where it forms a point, is a tract of land for a century or more known as Long Hook Farm. It was the patrimonial estate of Major Peter Jaquett, who served with distinction as an officer in the First Delaware Regiment during the Revolution. His remains were borne to the grave by sixty young men, who thus wished to do honor to his memory. . . . He was one of the first converts of this region to Methodism during the visit here of George Whitefield. His house was known far and near and was visited by many persons who shared his hospitality. Washington, Lafayette and Bishop White were among his guests. He was one of the ideal patriots of the great struggle for independence, and he never wearied relating the stories of that eventful period, describing many thrilling scenes in which he was a participant. He was a great favorite of children, and loved to relate to them the stories of the past. By his house on the North side of the Causeway were tall sycamore trees, lofty poplars and beautiful evergreens. The birds of early spring-time early visited him, built their nests in the shady places around his mansion, tuned their voices with sweet melody to entertain the old veteran and his guests, and remained until late in the fall. A beautiful ivy vine covered one end of the dwelling. It was gathered from the castle where Mary, Queen of Scots, was imprisoned, and presented to Mrs. Jaquett. She, also, cultivated the first Champney rose in this vicinity, and was a great lover of the beautiful in nature."

Ibid., p. 255:

"Peter Jaquett was born on the family estate of Long Hook, on the Christiana opposite Wilmington, and enlisted in Haslet's regiment early in 1776. He was by Haslet's side when the latter was killed at the battle of Princeton,

and subsequently joined Hall's battalion as Captain of the Fourth Company. It was a Wilmington tradition that when Baron De Kalb was fatally wounded at the Battle of Camden he fell into the arms of Jaquett.

"The major served from 1776 until the close of the war, spending but six weeks at home in all that time. He was in thirty-two battles and many skirmishes, and was twice wounded, though not severely. When Cornwallis' surrender at Yorktown ended the war he was at the South and was placed by General Greene in charge of a party of sick and wounded men, with instructions to convey them home, which he succeeded in doing after many hardships. Passing through Virginia, they were made welcome at the home of a patriot, where a lady presented Jaquett with some gold pieces which she had secreted. In after years he repaid her heirs the principal and interest, amounting to over five hundred dollars. He arrived at home, broken down in health, to find that his estates had almost gone to ruin during his absence. His physician directed him to take a voyage to the West Indies in search of renewed vigor, but he had no money to spend on such a trip. Joseph A. Tatnall, the miller, offered him twelve hundred barrels of flour, with the proceeds of which he paid the expenses of his journey and returned in full physical soundness. He survived until September 13, 1834, and was eighty years old when he died. He was buried by the side of his wife, Eliza Price, of Chester, Pa., in the Old Swedes' Cemetery. The stone above his grave records his eminent services to his country. He left no issue."

In speaking of the Regiment of St. Clair, is quoted, "I distinctly recollect two of the officers of this regiment, Major Bennet and Major Jaquett. . . . Major Peter Jaquett was a small, thick set man. His family were quite large land-holders in New Castle Hundred. After the war he settled on his farm at the end of the Causeway, on the road from Wilmington to New Castle, and lived there till his death in 1834. He and Bennett, unlike soldiers generally, were not friends; they had not spoken to each other for years prior to Jaquett's death. From what I have heard of Jaquett, it was a hard matter for any one to keep on speaking terms with him. He was a cross, morose, quarrelsome man. Upon one occasion, having lost some wheat, i.e. without cause, accused a neighbor, a very respectable man, a Mr. Thomas Tatlow, of stealing it, and wherever he went he was open and loud in his assertion that 'Tom Tatlow was a thief.' Tatlow sued him for slander, and recovered quite a heavy verdict. The late Judge Booth, who was his counsel, in explaining to him his liability for his charge against Tatlow, told him that certain language was actionable in itself, that is, if he called Tatlow a thief, or charged him with any other felony, Tatlow could recover without showing any special damage, but that there were certain names which he could call him, without rendering himself liable to damages, unless Tatlow could show special damage. This explanation of the Judge was the old soldier's chance. He persuaded the Judge to put these words on paper, and wherever and whenever he afterward met Tatlow, he would go through the roll of names, so long as Tatlow remained in earshot."

"The inscription upon his tomb in the old Swedes' Church, in Wilmington, states:

"That he was born April 6th, 1754, and died upon his farm at Crane Hook, September 13, 1834, aged 80 years.

"That he joined the Delaware Regiment, January 4th, 1776, and was in every general engagement under Washington which took place in Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and the Eastern States; was ordered South to the Southern Army under Bates, and with the brave De Kalb was in the battle of Camden, where the Delaware Regiment of eight companies was reduced to two, of ninety-six men each, and when the command devolved on Kirkwood and himself as oldest captains. Was in the battles of Guilford, second battle of Camden, siege of '96, and battle of the village of that name; battle of Eutaw Springs, and in every other battle under Greene, until the capture of Cornwallis at Yorktown.

"This is a little too strongly and freely drawn, but is, in the main, true. Major Jaquett left no children."

"We, the Officers of the Delaware Regiment, do, in the most grateful manner, thank the Honourable, the House of Assembly, for the two generous Resolves they were pleased to pass in our favor. But whilst we thus express our gratitude, we cannot but complain, that through some defect in the Resolves, or neglect in those who were intrusted with the execution of them, we find our situation little better than it was before they were passed. We have yet received but two months of the supplies allowed, and have no prospect of receiving any more, as Colonel

Craighead informs the Commanding officer in a letter, dated October 7th, '79, that he has received but 1400 pounds to purchase a quarterly supply of necessaries, that it is inadequate to the purpose, and therefore desires we will each take a dividend of that money in lieu of the necessaries which we are entitled to receive from him, by the Resolve of the Honourable House. This desire we must refuse to comply with, for we cannot conceive that the Honourable House would wish we should compound with Colonel Craighead, and accept one-third of the value, instead of the articles; as this would, in a very great measure, deprive us of the benefit of the Resolve, and again subject us to suffer by the depreciation of our currency, which evil their resolve was generously intended to prevent.

"We further beg leave to acquaint the Honourable House that of the suit of clothes, which they have ordered us to be supplied with, though the season is so far advanced, none of us have received a full suit, some, not one article, and in general, we want many things that are difficult to obtain, and cannot be dispensed with at this season, but at the risk of our health.

"We would also beg leave to represent to the Honourable House, how necessary a part of an officer's dress a hat is, and that we imagine a mistake only was the cause of its not being enumerated among the other articles of clothing, and, therefore, hope they will be pleased to allow us that useful article. We also hope the Honourable House will continue their bounty by allowing us a suit of clothes yearly, at least whilst the currency remains depreciated.

"Lahoring under many difficulties which the distance from our respective homes, and the general depreciation of the money had thrown among us, we were once before obliged to make application to the Honourable House for their assistance in removing or alleviating them. The spirit of generosity shown in their resolves on that occasion, encourages us to submit this to their consideration, confident that the welfare and honor of the

Regiment, that claims this patronage, are next to the happiness of their country, their greatest wish, and that upon this representation of our case, they will minutely enquire, from what cause their resolves have not been executed, and make such provision for their execution, as will in future prevent applications of this kind from their

"Sacred to the Memory of Major Peter Jaquett, a distinguished officer of the Revolution Army, who died at his residence—Long Hook farm—near this City, September 13th, A. D. 1834, in the 80th year of his age, having been born on the 6th of April, 1755. On the fourth of January, 1776, he joined the Delaware Regiment, and until April, 1780, he was in every general engagement under Washington, which took place in Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and the Eastern States. He was then ordered to join the Southern army under General Gates; and with the brave De Kalb he was in the battle of Camden, of the 16th of August, in which the Delaware Regiment, consisting of eight companies, was reduced to two only, of ninety-six men each, the command of which devolved upon his brave comrade Kirkwood and himself, as the oldest officers left of this gallant band. He was also in the battle of Guilford Court House, the second battle of Camden, and in the battle of Eutaw Springs. He assisted in the siege of '96, and capture of the village of that name; and was also in every action and skirmish under General Green, in whose army he remained until the capture of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown. He returned to his native State in 1782, and in 1794 married Eliza P. Price, daughter of Elisha Price, of Chester, Pa., and, as a farmer, he lived upon his paternal estate until his death. The brave and honored soldier—the kind and obliging neighbor and friend.

"Beneath this stone also repose the remains of Eliza P. Jaquett,

Wife of Major Peter Jaquett, who was born November 25th 1769, and died May 5th 1834. She was an af-

fectionate and devoted wife, a kind and humane mistress, and a warm and untiring friend. In early life she became a regular member of the Episcopal Church, to which and its ordinances she always remained devotedly attached, trusting to her Saviour alone for pardon and forgiveness, and in his gracious promises for the hope of a blessed immortality.

"Hear what the voice from Heaven declares

To those in Christ who die Released from all their cares,
They reign with him on high."

"OBITUARY OF MAJ. PETER JAQUETT.

"Preservative of the name and fame of a good man and a hero, we are asked to republish the following obituary of Major Peter Jaquett, who died September 12,* 1834:

"The deceased was a soldier of the Revolution, and one of the bravest of those brave men who have immortalized the most glorious page in our country's history. In January, 1775, at the age of 20, he received the appointment of lieutenant in the gallant regiment of Delaware, and in January following was promoted to a captaincy. In both ranks his gallant friend and comrade, Kirkwood, was his senior by one day. From the very commencement of the war to its close, Major Jaquett was in constant and active service, with the single intermission of a furlough of above three months. During that period he was engaged in thirty battles in the field, besides sieges and storms. In every general engagement that was fought between New York and Charleston, Kirkwood commanding the *first*, and Jaquett the *second* company of Delaware, fought shoulder to shoulder in the front of the battle—for the Delaware regiment was always there. We dwell with melancholy, but justifiable and patriotic pride, on the merits and

services of that gallant corps, which during the War of Independence enlisted more than 4000 men, and at its close was reduced by battle and death to two companies, Kirkwood's and Jaquett's collected from the fragments of repeated and desperate conflicts. Major Caleb P. Bennett, the present Governor of our State, remains the only survivor of the commissioned officers of the regiment. Delaware makes but a poor figure on the pension list; few, very few of her Revolutionary soldiers survive to partake of the bounty or swell the burden of their country—their bones lay whitening on the fields of Princeton, Long Island, Brandywine, Germantown, Monmouth, Camden, Cowpens, Guilford Court House, Ninety-six and Eutaw—days in which the Delaware regiment was relied on as the *élite* of the army, always prompt with the bayonet, and never turning its back upon the foe.

"In all these battles Major Jaquett was an ardent participator; at Camden, where the Delaware regiment was cut down from *eight* companies to *two*, and he and Kirkwood were the only captains that survived—where the brave De Kalb, expiring under multiplied wounds, with his dying breath expressed his admiration and invoked the blessing of heaven upon the brave Delawares and Marylanders who had fought by his side; at Cowpens, where the Delawares and Marylanders, under Col. Howard, turned the tide of battle, routed Tarleton's legion and secured a splendid victory; at Eutaw, where they advanced with trailed arms upon the chivalry of England, and drove them from the field at the bayonet's point. In these, and in all the general actions fought in the Southern and Middle States, Jaquett and his comrades were to be seen fighting where the battle was hottest, and never retreating but from the sternest necessity, and then with their faces to the foe. Many instances of the gallant bearing of Major Jaquett have been related to us, one of which we cannot forbear to put on record. In the disastrous battle of Camden, and in the heat of that bloody conflict, the Baron De Kalb, while standing a little in ad-

vance of the Delaware regiment, had his horse shot under him, and as he lay endeavoring to extricate himself, a British horseman rushed upon him and was upon the point of putting the gallant veteran to the sword, when Jaquett sprung from the line, drove his spontoon through the Englishman, in sight of both armies, secured his horse and placed the Baron upon it. At this moment De Kalb received a fatal wound and fell into the arms of Jaquett, to whom his last words were expressive of gratitude and admiration of his daring conduct.

"When the war had ceased and his country's independence was secured, Major Jaquett retired to his paternal farm—Long Hook—on the banks of the Christiana, where he resided to the day of his death. Here, retired from the busy scenes of the world, he led the life of an independent gentleman—seeking nothing for himself, but taking a warm interest in the growing prosperity of the country which he had so well served. His constitution, unbroken by the toils and sufferings of eight campaigns, was vigorous and robust; his habits temperate and regular; and he enjoyed uninterrupted health until within a few months, when the death of his wife—she who for forty years had been the faithful and affectionate partner of his joys and cares—struck a blow from which he never recovered. The heart of the old soldier broke under this dispensation—he dragged out a weary existence for a few months, but the spirit and animation which in a remarkable degree distinguished him, had fled forever.

"His death was characteristic of his life—he met the king of terrors with the calm intrepidity of a soldier, and just before he died, feeling his end approaching, he directed his attendants to raise him on his feet, that he might die standing—and breathed his last while they were complying with his wishes.

"His remains were interred on the 15th, in the burying ground of the old Swedes' Church, with all the honors due to a distinguished soldier and patriot. A detachment of the Washington Grays, under Lieut. Ritchie, attended to pay the last military honors to the veteran. Sixty young men from Wilmington repaired to his residence to bear

his honored remains to their resting place, a distance of more than two miles. The Governor of the State, his last surviving comrade, was there as principal mourner; the Mayor and City Council and a vast concourse of citizens closed the procession. The bells were tolling during the day, and a volley of musketry fired by the detachment gave notice that the grave had closed over as brave and true a soldier as ever drew his sword for his country."

VIII. 506. LIEUT. JOSEPH JAQUET,* son of Peter Jaquet (480) and Ann ———, m. Susanna Jaquett (368) dau. of Peter Jaquet (352) and Martha ———, April 17, 1750, the Rev. Israel Acrelius performing the ceremony (O. S. R., 685). They resided in New Castle Hundred. After the death of her first husband, she m. Hance Jaquett, Oct. 28, 1783. Dec. 26, 1788, admn. of the estate of Hance Jaquett was granted, the widow Susanna renouncing (*Liber M*, p. 297). Joseph Jaquet was commissioned a Third Lieutenant April 6, 1776, First Battalion, Captain Lewis Farmer's Company, Penna. Rifle Regiment commanded by Col. Samuel Miles; promoted to Second Lieutenant May 28, 1776; killed in battle on Long Island, Aug. 27, 1776 (Pa. Ar., 2nd Ser., vol. X., p. 201). Aug. 21, 1778, admn. on his estate was granted to John Young and John David Willpert (Phila., *Liber I*, p. 10). May 20, 1791, a pension was granted Susannah Jaquet in consequence of the death of her first husband (Phila., Orphans' Court, *Liber No. 16*, 1791–1793, pp. 28, 30). Aug. 6, 1794, the Comm. of Pa. granted two tracts of land, of two hundred acres each, to Susanna Jaquet, in trust for herself and her children, in recognition of the services of her first husband, said tracts being No. 509, situate in District No. 3, and No. 1594, situate in District No. 8, both on the West side of the Allegheny
