

NEW RAILROAD COMPANY TAKES OVER OLD CONCERN

Court Orders Receiver to Turn Over Property of the Queen Anne's Railroad

Judge Edward G. Bradford in United States Court yesterday afternoon granted the petition of the Maryland, Delaware and Virginia Railroad Company, recently formed, asking that the property of the Queen Anne's Railroad Company, which the new company recently acquired, be turned over to the latter company. The petition was filed in consequence of a suit pending between the Queen Anne's Ferry and Equipment Company vs. the Queen Anne's Railroad Company and Frank Ehlen, the receiver appointed in the case. It sets forth that all the parties to the suit were willing that the transfer should be made; that the new company was willing to give the necessary bond to pay the claims of all creditors who have claims taking precedence over the mortgage liens under which the property was sold.

The court ordered the new company to give bond for \$100,000 to cover the claims mentioned in the petition. The bond will at once be given and the entire property of the old Queen Anne's Railroad Company turned over to the new company by the receiver.
