

## MAIL ON THE QUEEN ANNE.

### SERVICE TO BE SOON ESTABLISHED BETWEEN BALTIMORE AND ELLENDALE.

President William H. Bosley, of the Queen Anne railroad, was notified yesterday by the Post Office Department that beginning August 9 a mail route would be operated over the Queen Anne railroad.

There will be two mails each way daily between Baltimore and Ellendale. Under the present mail arrangements the mail goes via Newark and Porters, on the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore railroad, and reaches Baltimore about the same time with the mail from Philadelphia. By the establishment of a mail route over the Queen Anne railroad, Baltimore mail will arrive several hours ahead of the Philadelphia mail. This will enable persons in Baltimore to write one day and get an answer the next, which will be of considerable advantage to the trade between that city and the Eastern Shore territory tributary to the new road.

The Queen Anne railroad is rapidly nearing completion to its western terminus. Tracks are now laid within two miles of Milton, and contract has been awarded to Wade, Burns & Co., to complete the road between Milton and Lewes, a distance of nine miles.
