To the Clerks and School Commissioners;

The following instructions will be of service to you in complying with the provisions of the NEW SCHOOL CODE:

Keep this letter until after you have settled with the Auditor on the dates mentioned below.

Collect all back taxes and pay all bills you can.

Hold no school election this year. The County Board will appoint a board of school trustees to serve until July 1, 1920. But on or before June 28 call a meeting of your tax-payers for the purpose of having a local audit of the accounts of your district. The State Auditor would like the O.K. of this meeting on the accounts when they are presented to him.

Do not make any assessment this year. The taxes are to be levied by the Legy Court of each county on the regular county assessment, BUT BE SURE TO BRING YOUR LAST ASSESSMENT LIST.

Find out from the people of the district whether the patrons of the school are willing to have the teacher reappointed for the next term.

Be prepared to tell the County Board what repairs are urgently needed at your school.

If you have not put in your coal for next term be prepared to tell the County Board how much you will need and what provision there is for storage.

It is very important that you, both clerks and commissioners, arrange to meet the Auditor at the places specified. There will be with him the County Superintendent and another representative of the County Board who will take over the affairs of your district.

Bring with you all your records, vouchers, unpaid bills, insurance policies, etc.

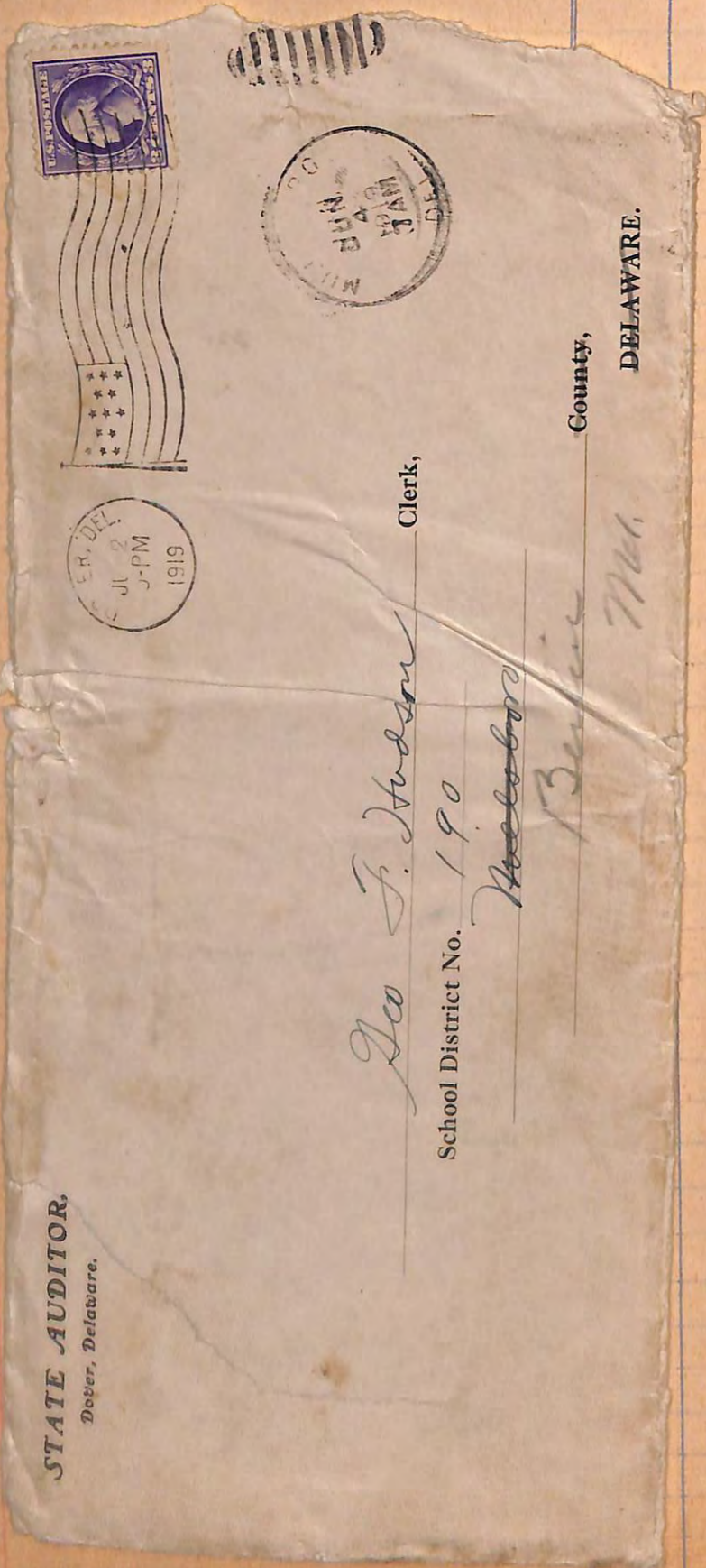
