### ANNUAL REPORT

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### Statutory Responsibility, Objectives Programs and Accomplishments

### I. Statutory Responsibility

Statutory responsibility of Delaware Technical and Community College is contained in House Bill 529 enacted in 1966. Briefly the purpose of the institution is to operate public institutions of learning for persons who have graduated from high school or are unable to attend public high schools.

### II. Objectives

- 1. Provide for the constantly changing educational needs in a constantly changing community.
- 2. Provide curriculum closely related to the economic and professional realities of the community.
- 3. Develop a comprehensive community college with strong emphasis on occupational-technical skills and knowledge.
- 4. Insure that individuals of all ability levels have access to all programs.
- 5. Establish the college's identity as a significant member of the community.
- 6. Develop the individuals ability to contribute to the increase of the economic base of the community.
- 7. Promote interdisciplinary mix--facilitate student reactions and changing interests.
- 8. Establish in the minds of the community that the college belongs to them.
- Develop a strong guidance system--help the student to attain useable educational goals.
- 10. Develop strong emphasis on attitude and motivation training.

### III. Programs, Goals & Accomplishments

Educational programs reflecting the objectives and statutory responsibility of the college are operational at the Georgetown and Wilmington campuses of the college and to a limited degree in Kent County in temporary facilities.

Construction is continuing on the campus at Fourth & Shipley Streets in Wilmington. Completion of this five-story, 102,000 sq. ft. building is now forecast for November 1973 with occupancy on January 1, 1974.

A ground-breaking ceremony was held on October 3, 1972, for the first phase of the Stanton Campus at I-95 and Churchmans Road. This building is being erected by means of Construction Management, Systems and Fast Track. If the forecast schedule is met, this building will be completed in September 1973.

Architectural planning is now being accomplished for the Kent County Campus and construction should start in July 1973.

We are still awaiting Federal matching funds from the Economic Development Administration for the construction of an Occupational Learning Resource Center at Georgetown. Receipt of the Federal funds and construction of the Learning Center should complete the major development of the Georgetown Campus for the foreseeable future.

### PLACEMENT REPORT 1972 Graduates Southern Branch

Delaware Technical & Community College, Southern Branch, held its Fourth Commencement Exercises, June 4, 1972. Associate Degrees in Applied Science were awarded in the following technologies:

Business Administration
Data Processing
Secretarial
Architectural Design
Civil Technology
Electronics-Electrical Engineering Technology
Industrial Engineering Technology
Mechanical Engineering Technology
Criminal Justice

Of the 130 graduates, employment information is available on 97.7%. Ninety-four students or 84.6% of those employed are working in the field for which they were trained. Seven percent are furthering their education. 1.5% are in the military service. 3.8% do not desire employment at this time because of marriage or other reasons and 2.3% did not respond to questionnaire.

In addition the employment rate for graduates of certificate programs such as Licensed Practical Nursing, Heavy Equipment Operators, etc., has been close to 100% of those desiring employment.

The mean average salary for all employed graduates of both branches is approximately \$7,500 per annum.

### PLACEMENT REPORT 1972 Graduates Northern Branch

Delaware Technical & Community College, Northern Branch, held its third commencement exercises June 4, 1972. An Associated Degree in Applied Science was awarded to the following twelve technologies:

Of the 146 graduates, 100% are employed, continuing their education, or have entered the military (employed, 82%; continuing education, 17%; military service, 1%). Of the graduates who are employed, 92% are pursuing careers directly related to the training received at Delaware Technical & Community College. Information is available on 100% of the graduates.
