

To the Senate and House of Representatives of the
State of Delaware in General Assembly met.

The petition of the Sheriff Com-
missioners of Sussex County beg leave to represent that
the Court house in Georgetown is in a ruinous and
irreparable condition, and is a wooden building.
That the several offices are also in frames,
buildings, private property and scattered in
various directions in said town, that great fears
are entertained that at some time great loss
may arise by a destruction of one or more of
the public offices, and desire that a law
may be passed, authorizing and requiring the
Sheriff of said County, to build a good and
sufficient Court house and five juror offices to
be paid for, out of the funds of said County,
at such times as the Sheriff may deem
right and proper - And as in duty bound
we will ever pray &c.
