At a general meeting of the freeholders and Inhabitants of the County of Newcastle on Delaware, at Newcastle the 29th of June 1774.

Resolved

That the Act of Parliament, for shutting up the Port of Boston is unconstitutional, oppressive to the Inhabitants of that Town, dangerous to the liberties of the British colonies, and that, therefore We consider our brethren at Boston as suffering in the common cause of America.
