MINUTES OF SESSIONS - GEORGETOWN PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

LEWES PRESBYTERY.

On Saturday, October 15th, 1859, the Presbytery of Lewes, received a memorial requesting the organization of a church in Georgetown, Delaware. This memorial was signed by the following persons:- Hon. Elisha D. Gullen, Margaret W. Cullen, Sydia W. Cullen, Margaret W. Cullen, Isaac Tunnell, Betty Tunnell, Matth w Wilson, John Harding, Rebecca Harding, Nancy Prettyman, Robert Prettyman, Mary E. Lynch.

In response to the Memorial 'Ministers Hames, Tries, and Mustard were appointed a Committee, if the way be clear to organize a church at Georgetown, Delaware" (Min. of Pres. 7 p.-27).

They reported at the next stated meeting of Presbytery as follows: -"That on the 27th day of January last (Jan. 27-1860) They organized a church at that place consisting of ten members received by Certificate from other churches, and that the Hon. E.D. Cullen was duly elected and installed as their Ruling Elder." Min. of Pres. 7 p.-39
