
THIRTY PENNIES EARN \$430 FOR A MILLSBORO CHURCH

From thirty pennies distributed in the Sunday school of Grace Methodist Episcopal Church, at Millsboro, nine months ago, by the late Rev. George R. Ellis, they have earned during that time four hundred and thirty dollars, which will be applied to the parsonage fund. Upon receiving the pennies, the Sunday school scholars put them to work earning something toward the fund. The children made investments, by clubbing together, in sugar, chocolate, flavors, etc. and made candy and sold. From the proceeds of their sales, they reinvested in different articles and kept on selling until the thirty pennies had earned for the church the amount reported.

Each person to whom one of the pennies had been given related their experience in making investments.

In addition to the amount collected by the novel plan, a quilt recently was sold for \$60, and the Washington's birthday supper given Friday night of last week netted \$125.00.

It may be a year before the committee in charge of the parsonage fund completes final plans for the construction of the building. So far no site has been purchased. During the spring and summer it is planned to hold a series of festivals and entertainments to swell the fund.
