

# Delaware's Role in the Revolutionary War


Delaware, first settled in 1638, became a key player in the American Revolution despite its small size. Initially part of Pennsylvania, the "Three Lower Counties" were governed by a separate legislature beginning in 1704. Residents' loyalty to Great Britain was tested as colonial resistance grew. The Lower Counties joined in resistance against the Stamp Act (1765) and Townshend Acts (1768), ultimately forming Committees of Correspondence to communicate with other colonies and ensure loyalty to the cause.


As tensions escalated, Thomas McKean, Caesar Rodney, and George Read represented the colony at the Continental Congress, which established Committees of Inspection to maintain order and support for the revolution in each colony. Despite some Loyalist opposition, Delaware was among the first to formally declare independence from Great Britain (and Pennsylvania) in 1776, establishing its own government.



Delaware's militia and Continental regiment fought in several Revolutionary War battles, including those at White Plains, Cooch's Bridge, Brandywine, and Germantown, and participated in major campaigns in the southern states. The Delaware Blues, as the regiment was known, played a crucial role in battles like Cowpens and Guilford Court House, and Delaware troops were present at the final British surrender at Yorktown in 1781.

Despite the hardships of war, including internal divisions and supply shortages, Delaware remained committed to the cause. After the war, Delaware's veterans were provided with pensions, and the state continued to play an essential role in American independence, being the first to ratify the U.S. Constitution.





# A Note on Arrangement

This guide is arranged numerically by collection number. Each entry includes the series title, resource identifier or item number, dates and extent of material relevant to the Revolutionary War, a summary of the topical content or the collection as a whole, container barcodes (if applicable), and notes linking to the full finding aid and other relevant resources. In some cases, a list of relevant records is provided.

The Military Archives collections (Record Group 1800) contain the most comprehensive materials on Delaware's involvement in the Revolutionary War, providing detailed insight into this critical aspect of the state's history during the period.

While this guide highlights key resources, it is not exhaustive. Researchers are encouraged to visit the Delaware Public Archives <u>Portal</u> or <u>visit us in person</u> to explore additional collections and materials related to Delaware's role in the Revolution. Users of the Portal should search for variant spellings of names, as important figures like John McKinly (McKinley) and John Haslet (Hazlet, Haslett) may appear under multiple spellings, which could affect search results. Summary:	Delaware's Privy Council, created by the 1776 Constitution, worked with the state's President to guide state affairs. The General Assembly, consisting of the House of Assembly and Legislative Council, selected the four members: two by the House and two by the Council. Photostats include acts of Congress pertaining to days of fasting and business of the Privy Council, including the export of flour to other states and Bermuda, complaints against Deputy Quartermaster General Francis Wade, the appointment of a deputy quartermaster, the state schooner Delaware, and efforts to regain state papers captured by the British.

The records show dates of meetings, names of members in attendance, and matters under consideration, such as appointments to committees, committee reports, petitions of local inhabitants, appointments of military officers, drafting of rules and regulations for the military, and complaints against certain officers. The Assembly consisted of twenty-one members, seven from each county, elected annually. Records include original manuscripts and printed documents, photostats, and typed transcripts. Matters of business include Delaware's separation from the British Crown and a call for a constitutional convention, an order for the arrest of Thomas Robinson, the making of a new state seal, provisions for the defense of the state, calls for days of fasting or thanksgiving, raising and payment of troops, punishments for treason, appointment of delegates to the Continental Congress, legislation against impressment, the Declaration of Independence, a report on the "disaffection" of Sussex County residents, money for the clothing of troops, currency issues, rations for the families of soldiers, the state schooner Delaware, the procurement of arms, France's place in peace negotiations, adjustment of depreciation scales, relief for the widows and children of Delaware troops, and a tombstone for Colonel John Haslet's gravesite.
